That's the subject of our upcoming Visioning Workshops – and you're invited! Over the course of three evening sessions we'll construct a vision that will give direction and coherence to our ministries for years to come. These workshops will be facilitated by Naomi Garcia, our Vital Church Initiative coach. Our vision should reflect the best thinking of the church as a whole, so we're hoping for broad-based participation.

The workshops will be held from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. on Wednesday, November 7th; Monday, November 12th; and Monday, November 19th.

ServSafe Food Handler Class

Judy Radant is offering another ServSafe Food Handler training on Saturday, Nov. 3rd, in Grams Hall for church volunteers who participate in church kitchen activities as well as for restaurant workers. The class lasts 4 hours, from 9 a.m. - 1 p.m. A light lunch will be served. An optional 1 hour additional training for use and care of commercial kitchen equipment will be available. This class will help you not only to increase your effectiveness in CFUMC Food Ministry work, but also to help you protect yourself and others from food-borne illnesses.

Class time will include review of the materials and testing. The test will be scored by the National Restaurant Association. Students who pass the test will receive official ServSafe Food Handler certification that is good nationwide for five years. Fee for the class for church members will paid for by the church. Thank you to those of you who walked into a difficult space at Quality 16 and emerged with the Ripple Effect of HOPE. I recently attended a showing of Angst and hope that you will find the time for this documentary as well.

Anxiety disorders are the most common mental health challenge in the U.S., impacting 54 percent of females and 46 percent of males, with age seven being the median age of onset, according to the World Health Organization. While anxiety disorders are highly treatable, only one-third of those suffering receive treatment. Everyone involved in the development of "Angst" has a personal experience with anxiety - from the producers to the interviewees.

"The conversation surrounding mental health really hits home for me," said Michael Phelps. "Many people don't understand how debilitating mental illness truly can be, and even more than that,

how common it is, yet people are afraid to have the serious discussions about it. I welcomed the opportunity to be a part of 'Angst' to further the dialogue around mental health and to help people understand the impact anxiety has on our mental state and encourage people, especially kids, to ask for help."


