# A Letter to all of the Women in our Church Family Greetings from the Material Girls



You are cordially invited to attend our first meeting of the year on Tuesday, February 10th, in Grams Hall, from 12:00 - 2:30 p.m..

During that time, we will work on projects that will be sold at the annual Children's Christmas Bazaar in December.

Some interesting facts about Material Girls: In 2014.

- Sixty women (at all levels of "craftiness") attended meetings, including several from other churches in Chelsea and neighboring communities.
- Meetings are held on the second Tuesday of each month - February through November - in Grams Hall, from noon until 2:30 p.m.
- 3200 items were made to sell at the bazaar for \$1 \$5 each. Items were made at meetings and as "take-ithome" kits. If you cannot attend daytime meetings, you are welcome to be a part of the group by completing kits at home at a time convenient for you.
- 300 children shopped at the bazaar. In order for that to happen, there were 106 volunteers working in shifts over a five hour period of time. The Thursday evening before the bazaar, families with children who have special needs shopped in a quiet, relaxed atmosphere.
- Members not only enjoy fellowship with other women, but they also support missions. Children from families aided by Faith in Action received checks so they could shop for their families. The Material Girls are making warm felted wool mittens, which will be given to Cass Community Social Services for the homeless.
