May 5th State Ballot Proposal: What is it; what would it do?

CHELSEA, MI – That is the topic to be discussed in a public information forum on Wednesday, April 8, 7 p.m., Chelsea Retirement Community Dancey House Theater, 805 W. Middle Street.

The League of Women Voters of the Ann Arbor Area with Sue Smith, president, LWV Michigan, will provide information on the ballot proposal to amend the Michigan Constitution and on new laws that will be triggered if the amendment is approved by the voters.

"The proposal is lengthy and complex,"
said Ann Arbor League president, Nancy Schewe.
The presentation will include information on how state
revenue would be increased and how it
would be spent. Pros and cons of passing the legislation
will also be discussed."

The League of Women Voters is a non-partisan political organization celebrating 95 years of Making Democracy Work by empowering voters to engage with government at every level through information and advocacy.

INTRODUCTION

Have you ever wanted something really badly and didn't get it?

Or maybe the answer wasn't "no". It was "we'll see" or "maybe". Sometimes that's even more frustrating.

What are you supposed to do? Just wait? Keep asking?

Give up? A lot of us feel that way when it comes to prayer.

Maybe you prayed and nothing happened. Maybe you wonder if God even heard you or if you should just give up and try to figure things out on your own.

That's exactly what some of Jesus' followers were wondering when He launched into one of his famous "Once Upon A Time" moments. It was a story about a man who needed something badly and his only option was to go to a friend in the middle of the night. He wasn't sure what the answer would be, but he had no other options.

And through his story we may just find the courage to pray and keep praying even when it's silent.
