sanctuary. At the intersection of the cross is a metal piece that has been permanently removed from the pews.

One of the youth remembered where the metal pieces once belonged and recalled how he used to play with them during service when he was younger. I think of the wood that lined the prayer chapel and wonder whose head once rested there in moments that someone sought guidance, expressed profound gratitude or found solace in the depths of sorrow. Did someone trace fingers along the ridges as they rested in that quiet place? Did a child hiding in the chapel during play notice the beauty in the variation of the bird's eye maple? Or was the silence of the hiding place their greatest comfort?

The room that once was, is no more.

The pews, the people, they change as well over time.

From the broken pieces and that which was cast aside comes a new creation; which bears witness to that which is unchanging always and forever. They came to the room last Sunday and willingly washed, sawed, nailed, and hammered with servant's hearts. They worked quietly and diligently to bring to fruition what will serve to 'build' the church.
