As part of the Capital Campaign, the middle school & high school youth program committed to raise funds for the sanctuary renovation. Last week began the process of constructing crosses from wainscoting that had been damaged in the removal from both the prayer chapel and the sanctuary. At the intersection of the cross is a metal piece that has been permanently removed from the pews. In it you may choose to place a prayer of gratitude or of longing. It can hold the picture of a loved one or a flower fresh from your garden.

Gratitude from Liberia

My soul is so lifted this morning. I am so glad for this declaration and also for your sharing. Thanks to all of you, our dear brothers and sisters in the Lord and dear partners in mission, for standing by us through your prayer and other means of support during those dark days in the history of our country.

I recall the months of August and September last year, that every phone call from home was the disclosure of the death news of someone I knew. They included churches brothers and sisters that I grew up with in the UM Youth Fellowship in my home city Buchanan, friends, pastors that I had served with as their district superintendent, lay leaders and council chairpersons, as well as other leaders whom I knew personally.

Some were folks who traveled the long walking distance (4 to 5 hours) with me to charge conferences and other church gatherings. I have slept in the homes of many of those people; they provided meals for me during those days for ministry with them. Yes, these were dedicated servants of the Lord.

May their souls rest in peace.

It came to a point when each time I recognized it was a call from home, I hesitated for a while to respond. I would fearfully wonder, whose death news is it this time? Is it my wife, any of my kids, my mom, or any of my brothers or sisters? Yes, it was a fearful and agonizing experience for me and I am certain, my country men and women everywhere..

But you stood by us, and most especially God did not abandon us as promised in his word.

We celebrate this joyful news this morning.

Although I am busy writing final term papers right now, but I just could not hold back these words of joy and gratitude to you all, and to thank God Almighty.

As we celebrate this good news, we continue to pray for our neighbors: Sierra Leone and Guinea. We hope and pray that soon and very soon, they too will be declared Ebola free.

To God be the glory, great thing he has done again.

Surely, as we usually sing at home
