RE-ROOFING PROJECT UPDATE

The roofing project is progressing well; the crews have been working from daylight to dusk to complete the work. And those workers are attracting plenty of attention from folks on the ground! Their nimble, sure-footedness is a sight to behold, especially on the steep sanctuary portions of the roof.

To date, we have received \$10,764 in contributions toward the roof. The matching grant offer is a dollar-fordollar match up to \$50,000. The projected cost of the re-reroof project is \$106,000. We are on our way to fully funding this project! If we are able to meet this matching grant challenge 100% before the end of December, we will greatly reduce, if not eliminate altogether, additional finance charges. Thank you for your responses of faith and generosity thus far.



Christmas Pageant Information came out this Sunday!

Yep, we are talking Christmas already! Your child was sent home with Christmas Pageant information and song lyrics on Sunday. This is a NEW Christmas Pageant this year with new opportunities for involvement, so please carefully review the parts to determine how your child would like to participate. A copy of what was sent home is included below in this newsletter as well.

I need to know your child's pageant part preferences by November 1st!!!

Important Dates:

Nov 1st: Deadline to RSVP to Courtney regarding your child's participation and 1st, 2nd, and 3rd part choices

Nov 8th: Pageant parts will be handed out after the 9:00 a.m. Worship Service (Look for a table in Grams Hall)

Nov 22nd: Costume Sunday! Children needing a costume for their part should stop by the storage room in the K-5 BLAST hallway to try on a costume. Costume times: 8:30-8:55 a.m., 10:30-10:55 a.m.

> Nov 29th: Make up date for children still needing a costume. Stop by the storage room in the K-5 BLAST hallway between 8:30-8:55 a.m., 10:30-10:55 a.m.

Saturday, Dec 12th: 9:00-11:00 a.m. ALL CHILDREN PRACTICE in the Sanctuary. Because this is the ONLY rehearsal, t is really important that EVERY child that wants to be in the pageant attend. We will go through the pageant twice.

Dec 13th: Pageant during 9:00 a.m. Worship Service. K-5 children arrive at 8:30 a.m.

and go to their BLAST classrooms to get their costumes. When preschoolers arrive to worship, they may choose to wear sheep "hats, mittens, and/or bibs". Preschoolers will sit with their families in reserved pews up front.
