Basic knowledge of office equipment

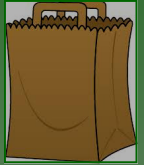

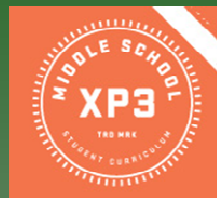

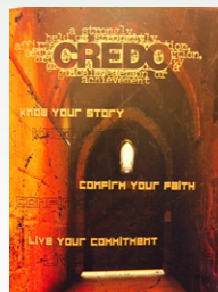
