We had the entire membership in attendance. First and foremost we are happy to report that we had received enough funding from the church community to fully match the roof replacement funding challenge. All the Trustees are thankful and grateful for your support and the roof will keep us dry for years to come. THANK YOU!

The fire extinguishers are nearing 12 years old. Since the cost of testing at this age and addressing issues is of equal cost to replacing them, we are going to replace them.

Our renovated sanctuary officially opened with our service on December 6 and we're so glad to be "home." We are proud of our sanctuary in it "new yet familiar" look.
