Material Girls give \$5000 to Faith-in-Action

Members of Material Girls hosted the 6th annual Children's Christmas Bazaar December 5th. A check for \$5000, the profits from the bazaar, was given to Julie Ripberger at a meeting of the Leadership Team. The group expressed their appreciation for the many ways Faith in Action serves families in Chelsea and gave them the check to help support programming in 2016.

The Material Girls, a 96-member organization, meets at Chelsea First United Methodist Church from February through November, on the second Tuesday of the month. Between noon and 2:30 p.m., members make the gifts that more than 350 children will purchase at the next bazaar.

This year, members made 5000 gifts, which they sold at four bazaars. The seven hundred gifts that were left over will be taken to Cass Community Social Services in Detroit for their Christmas Store.

At the same time the gifts are delivered,
200 pairs of hand-made, felted wool mittens will be delivered for
the homeless in the neighborhoods of both Cass Community
Social Services and the Brightmoor Campus.
The mittens were made by the Material Girls and our
