- 99** **Spiritual Warfare (Rev. Edwon D. Brown)** – A confident Christian should recognize the subtle wickedness of Satan, and his attempt to infiltrate the church through the members. This class is designed to teach students to encourage themselves and to claim victory during the test.
- 104** **How to Read and Study the Bible (Rev. Haywood A. Robinson III)** – This course identifies methods and approaches to Bible study that can lead to spiritual growth and Christian maturity. Students will be exposed to the three major steps of methodical Bible study, along with resources to aid personal study.
- 105.8** **Christian Apologetics (Rev. Larry Hentz)** – This study will focus on the importance of having the ability to defend one’s faith at all times. Students will focus on their own faith and, at the same understand enough of other belief systems to be able to effectively engage in evangelism and outreach.
- 115.2** **Psalm 1-89: Glorifying God for Who He Is (Rev. Lanier Twyman)** – The book of Psalms is the irreplaceable devotional guide, prayer book, and hymnal of the people of God. The class will help students develop a better understanding of David and other contributors and how to have a personal relationship with God as we tell Him our hurts and our needs.
- 127.27/1112** **The Book of Revelation (Rev. John T. Rhodes)** – This course will focus on the Book of Revelation with emphases on authorship, date, theme, and recipients. The prophetic themes, symbols, and interpretations of various revelations will be discussed.
- 216A** **Exploring the Bible with Children (Ages 3-5, Sister Evelyn D. W. Jones)** – This class will offer exciting, fun activities for children as they explore the Bible and seek to learn stories of old.
- 216B** **Exploring the Bible with Children (Ages 6-8, Sister Ida Ware)** – This class will offer exciting, fun activities for children as they explore the Bible and seek to learn stories of old.
- 216C** **Exploring the Bible with Children (Ages 9-12, Deaconess Cheryl Eatmon)** – This class will offer exciting, fun activities for children as they explore the Bible and seek to learn stories of old.

- 661** **The Work of the Church Trustee (Rev. J. Michael Little)** – Students will be introduced to the work and role of trustees in the church.

- 662** **The Role of the Deaconess (Deaconess Fran Jones)** – Participants will gain knowledge of the relationship of Deaconess and servant ministry. It offers the challenge to move beyond the communion table in the local church.
- 855.1** **Women in Ministry Seminar (Rev. Kecia Ford)** – This course provides an overview of how a woman’s spiritual gifts, personality, experiences, cares/passions, interest, abilities and talents make her special and contribute to her God-given purpose.

- 901** **Ministers’ Wives Seminar (Sisters Marie Quick and Sherl Streeter)** – This course will explore the issues and challenges that ministers’ wives face today.
- 906.4** **Christian Educators’ Seminar (Rev. A. Michael Black), Educating Congregations: Cultivating the Future of the Mission** – The church faces the challenge of declining enrollments in Bible studies, Sunday Schools, and discipleship classes; diminishing influence on the moral tone of its neighbors; evidence of biblical illiteracy, and increasing reliance on marketing strategies to attract and hold new members. This year’s seminar aims to provide Christian Education Directors/Leaders with tools and information to educate congregations for the future and help them become communities of hope and meaning.

- 912.8** **Angels and Demons (Rev. Charles Russell)** – In this class you will become acquainted with their names, titles, functions, and how they operate within the physical and spiritual realms.
- 913.8** **Financing and Budgeting the Work of the Church (Rev. Eric Baldwin)** – This course will provide information critical to the development and operation of a total church budget that integrates the mission, money, and message of the church. The course will emphasize tithing, corporate management responsibility, planning strategies, and a strong emphasis on immediate needs and long-range goals.
- 1001** **Let It Go (Forgiveness) (Rev. Keith Byrd)** – Why have you not forgiven? This course will teach us to “LET IT GO” to be released from not only un-forgiveness but also guilt, shame and pain.

- 8000 Church Security (Rev. Bernard M. Taylor)** – A good security team needs to plan and prepare how to deal with different types of situations facing the churches. This class will provide basic training in a variety of situations.
- 20000 The Study of Last Things (Rev. Tyrone Queen)** – The doctrine of last things sets forth the truth that the world will reach its appointed consummation. This course will cover the subjects of physical death; the immortality of the soul; the intermediate state; the Second Coming of Christ; the Millennium; the resurrection of the dead, and heaven and hell.
- 40000 Dispensations and Covenants (Rev. Wallis Baxter III)** – Covenants prescribe and dispensations describe the structure of the progressive revelation of God’s plan for the ages. This course describes the relationship of the biblical covenants to the seven dispensations, with regard to the duration and characteristic of each Dispensation and the Covenant that are in force.
- eQuip Excellence in Organizational Leadership (Rev. Jerome Holmes)** – This course examines what leadership entails, along with developing an understanding of organizational cultural elements of alignment, accountability, accomplishment and acceleration. Students will gain a fresh perspective of what it takes to build and sustain a successful organization by understanding leadership at the personal, interpersonal, team and organizational levels. CEUs are available for students who attend five (5) nights.

After the War: Our Wounded Warriors (Rev. and Mrs. Hugh Lee Elmore)** – Many soldiers are returning from active duty in a combat zone with the major challenges of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder, Traumatic Brain Injury or suicide. This workshop provides answers and resources needed to help our wounded warriors.
