

Throughout the Advent evening services and the 5pm Christmas Eve worship service, we began each liturgy with "Jesus Christ is the light of the world." Rarely do we have to sit in total darkness. We, today, are surrounded by lights. Yes, even when we shut off the lights we still have lights from night lights, from alarm clocks, from charging gadgets we can't seem to live without, as well as all the lights of the city that help to keep us safer during the darkest parts of our nights. When our liturgies were formed electrical lights were non-existent and people relied on lanterns and candles--the light of fire--for light in the darkness. In our sanctuary we are reminded by the eternal light of a candle that always burns and hangs near the baptismal font area of the *light* Christ is in our sin-ridden world.

Today there is still great comfort in knowing that Jesus Christ is the light of our world, too! In our darkest days (and moments) we can always have the peace that passes all human understanding because He is <u>always there with His love</u> and shines in our darkness.

During this season of Epiphany, note how many references are made to "light" in our Bible readings and hymns each Sunday. Look at the lights of the sky day and night. Thank God for sending His Son as the Light for all the world!
