I was born in Leesburg, Florida where I was baptized at First Presbyterian Church. We moved to Sarasota when I was five, where my parents, sisters, and their families still live.



During these 'secular work' years, God prepared me to answer His call, giving me life experience which was invaluable preparation for ministry.

I began my pastoral studies the fall of 1989, at Columbia Theological Seminary in Atlanta. I believe I was the first inquirer/candidate to move through the process of the newly formed Peace River Presbytery.

During my second year of seminary, I was blessed to meet Kim, a lifelong Presbyterian and a "Georgia Peach," who was an attorney and worked outside of Atlanta. After my graduation in 1992, Kim and I married and I answered the call to serve two yoked churches in Greens-burg, Kentucky.

Statement Of Faith:
