2013 Mt. Moriah Baptist Church Ministries Outreach Projects

Christian Education

- August 24th: Annual Health Festival. Every year CEM takes the lead to coordinate the health fair. It included the HIV mobile testing van, Transcultural mental health mobile van, hearing professionals, EMS professionals conducting blood pressure and diabetes screening.
- October 26th: We sponsored a flu shot clinic and 15 people were serviced. Of that amount 7 did not have health insurance and were covered by LCHC funding.

Church School

• On January 22nd – Flyer Distribution – Volunteers from various classes distributed fliers in the neighborhood inviting them to Church School and worship service.

Deacon Ministry

- Center for Children, Youth, and Families formerly St Anne's Infant Center
- HSC Pediatric Center
- St. Jude's Ranch for Children Recycled Card Program—we collected greeting cards from our parishioners. We sent 2 large boxes containing the fronts only to St Jude's Ranch for Children Recycled Card Program to benefit abused and neglected youth.
- Angel Tree
- Clothing Missionary

Deaconess Ministry

- Picked up food products from Emery Church monthly for the Food Pantry; stocked shelves and filled bags with food to give out to needy Church and community families every fourth Thursday and whenever needed. An average of 40 persons is served each month.
- Purchased necessary items for the Food Pantry and Baptism Closet that were not issued on a regular schedule; for example, meats, towels, clothing and whatever and/or whenever we were short of any needed food or clothing item.

Dorcas Missionary Ministry

- Organized and distributed over 100 Thanksgiving baskets to needy recipients of the church and community.
- Participated in the Annual Health Community Day by distributing clothing to the needy in the church parking lot.
- Distributed clothing from the clothing closet on an at-need basis; on 2nd Saturday mornings each month to shelters, accompanying the Evangelism Ministry; and on 4th Thursday of each month, accompanying the Deaconess Ministry.

Drama, Envelope, Finance and Men's Ministries

- The principle "target" for our Outreach was supporting the Solomon G. Brown center, located in Southeast Washington. The center handles medical, social and humanitarian services.
 - We provided Two Hundred and sixty-one dollars (\$261.00) in vouchers for Safeway and Giant food cards, to be made available to many in need of emergency food.
 - This year, our "hands on" activity was in two phases, namely on December 11th, 12th and 13th, at Salvation Army's center in Northeast Washington where we actively participated in "stuffing" the Angel Tree Bags, and then, on December 17th thru the 20th, several members participated in the "distribution" of the bags.

Evangelism Ministry

• Second Saturday of each month we ministered to and served food to the following Homeless Shelters in Washington, DC: Harriet Tubman Women's Center, Open Door Shelter for Women, CCNC Shelter, and John L. Young Center for Women.

Hospitality Ministry and Women's Day

• On Tuesday, April 24, 2013, the Hospitality Ministry along with the Women's Day participants volunteered at So Others Might Eat (SOME), located at 71 "O" Street, NW. We assisted the SOME staff on the serving line for lunch from 10:45AM – 1:15PM. A delicious lunch was enjoyed by 369 guests. The guest came in smiling and greeting us and thanking us while they were being served. One guest sang a song, "O, How I Love Jesus".

Ministerial Staff

- Ministerial staff coordinated efforts to purchase and contribute over 25 new backpacks full of new school supplies for DC public school 5th graders in preparation for their new school year. This church-wide effort was in support of the Capitol Hill Group Ministry's 2013 "Back to School Back Pack Program." Collectively, we planned to meet the needs of a full classroom of returning 5th graders. Thanks to strong support from the Mt. Moriah Baptist Church family, we exceeded that goal. Capitol Hill Group Ministry estimated the monetary value of each full, new backpack to be approximately \$42.93. Accordingly, this outreach project contributed more than \$1,000 in value to the community. More importantly, it garnered good will and gratitude that enhanced our partnership with Capitol Hill Group Ministry.
- The project was also supported by Pastor Chuck Wolfinbarger of the Vineyard Community Church in Franklin, OH, who contributed \$100 to our outreach project, after hearing an appeal for support during the Sunday worship service at our church retreat in Deep Creek, MD. Minister McCrea had invited Pastor Wolfinbarger and two of his church's disciples to worship with us. His entire donation was used to purchase new backpacks and new school supplies.

Music Ministry

- Handel's "Messiah" Rehearsals—thirteen (13) churches and two (2) other community organizations participated; relationships were renewed and started through associations with the various participating church aggregations was simply awesome. In fellowship together many expressed that the group was unique, spirited and a pleasure to be with.
- Handel's "Messiah" The Glory Revealed Concert—was held at Eastern High School, Washington, DC in Ward 6; four-hundred and fifty persons were in attendance from across the Delaware, Maryland, and Virginia areas for this awesome evening of a time-honored sacred work; Approximately This event proved multi-generational and multi-cultural, both important aspects of Mt. Moriah's current ministry and strategic plan.
- Handel's "Messiah" Canned Food Drive proved to be an undeniable success. Audience members and concert participants donated 2.532lb.s of canned foods to the Capital Hill Area Food Bank located in Washington, DC.

Prison Ministry

• "Angel Tree Project" was held December 15, at 1:00pm in the lower auditorium. I requested 110 children from the Prison Fellowship. From the list of 110 children, 97 children parent/caretakers were contacted, 91 Angels and 32 parents/caretakers attended the luncheon/ program.

- Provided financial support for Thanksgiving Baskets
- Gave yearly monetary donations to: St. Ann's Infant & Maternity Home and the HSC Pediatric Center

Senior Usher Ministry

- The following are the Outreach for "2013":
 - We collected 86 pairs of eyeglasses turned over to the Lions Club to be sent out for reuse.
 - Thirteen cell phones turned into the Family Crisis Center which 3000 minutes will be added by AT&T to be used by Families or Abused Ladies in case of emergency.
 - We proved the funds for the lunch at the Angel Tree Program also several members accepted an Angel.
 - Annual (20 Years) the Ministry Support-A-Child/Family Project, this year we are supporting a family with five children. We purchased many clothing items dress and casual, coats, school supplies, each a toy or game, educational books, family games and a food basket.
 - We prepared and delivered 10 large food baskets for the Christmas to needed families.

Trustee Ministry

• On July 6, 2013 we prepared and delivered specialized meals and groceries to men, women and children living with HIV/AIDS, cancer and other life-challenging illnesses.
