Families with multiple children required shopping, packing and labeling a separate bag for each child. (The record was ten (10) children). Three of the seven days were worked "fetching the bags, (and often assembled bicycles or large boxed items) for the family member who came to retrieve the gifts.
- We donated \$235.00 to be used to purchase grocery store feeding voucher for families in need at the Solomon G. Brown Center is Southeast Washington (A Salvation Army Center).

Dream Team

- Worked with the Divine Nine Greek Organizations in packing food baskets for Thanksgiving.
- Partnered with the Ministerial Staff to provide after-school snacks for Sasha Bruce House.

- We also hand out oranges, snack bars and apples occasionally when they are donated by some of our Evangelism Ministry members.
