Audio, Drama, Envelope, Finance and Men's Ministries

- \$100 to the Salvation Army specifically to purchase food vouchers for the Solomon G. Brown Center in Southeast Washington and a check in the amount of \$100 t Sisters4Sisters to be used to purchase warm clothing.
- \$39.98 purchasing diapers, baby wipes and other items which we donated to Women's Ministry outreach project.
- Performed "hands on" outreach at the Salvation Army's Warehouse assisting in their yearly Angel Tree event.

Culinary Ministry

• Prepared and served food for the Angel Tree Program and Sermon in the Park.

Deacon Ministry

- Provided assistance and visited St. Ann's Infant and Maternity Home
- Donated to HSC Pediatric Center (formerly Hospital for Sick Children)
- Participated in the Angel Tree Program
- Participated in the Community Health Fair

Deaconess Ministry

- Picked up food products from Emery Church monthly for the Food Pantry; stocked shelves and filled bags with food to give out to needy Church and community families every fourth Thursday and whenever needed. An average of 40 persons is served each month.
- Purchased necessary items for the Food Pantry and Baptism Closet that were not issued on a regular schedule; for example, meats, towels, clothing and whatever and/or whenever we were short of any needed food or clothing item.
- Attended and assisted the GBDA with services at Stoddard Baptist Home.
- Supported the Angel Tree Project, Thanksgiving Basket, and Payne Elementary School supplies.

Dorcas Missionary Ministry

- Led fellowship services and distribute Christmas gifts to one floor of the Stoddard Baptist Home on December 23, 2011
- Organized and distributed over 100 Thanksgiving baskets to worthy recipients of the community.
- Participated in the Annual Community Day by distributing clothing to the needy in the church parking lot.
- Distributed clothing from the clothing closet on an at-need basis; on 2nd Saturday mornings each month to shelters, accompanying the Evangelism Ministry; and on 4th Thursday of each month, accompanying the Deaconess Ministry.

Evangelism Ministry

- Second Saturday of each month we ministered to and served food to the following Homeless Shelters in Washington, DC: Harriet Tubman Women's Center, Open Door Shelter for Women, CCNC Shelter, and John L. Young Center for Women.
- We prepared and served a total of 3,510 packaged meals to residents of the above homeless shelters (contained—2 sandwiches, Christian Tract, fruit, coffee, orange juice, and bottled water)
- During the hours of 6-8am the meals were served. Prayers were rendered before the meals
 and upon requests from the residents, ministry members met with residents privately and
 offered up personal prayers on their behalf. Residents were invited to worship with the Mt.
 Moriah Baptist Church family and residents were also invited to unite with Christ. Some
 residents accepted the invitation and worshiped with Mt. Moriah at different times and one
 resident of Harriet Tubman Women's center joined Mt. Moriah.
- We participated with other ministries of the church and served over 1000 homeless men and women at CCNC Shelter. We also made a monetary contribution for this event.
- We distributed over 6,000 Christian Religious Tracts, "Our Daily Bread," and other pertinent Christian literature.

Hospitality Ministry

• The Hospitality Ministry voted to assist in purchasing uniforms for Payne Elementary. After discussions with the Senior Stars Ministry (who had also taken on this project and did not receive positive feedback) and with the Pastor's consent, it was decided that we would do an in-reach project. This in-reach project consists of giving the library a 'face lift'. At the present time, the Hospitality Ministry has not adopted another school. Adopting another school will be one of our priorities when we meet on January 14, 2012.

Mentorship Ministry

• We participated with other ministries of the church and served over 1000 homeless men and women at CCNC Shelter. We also made a monetary contribution for this event.

Ministerial Staff

• Provided outreach services through its support of Mt. Moriah's first-ever old-time Revival in the Park. The Revival took place on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday nights (August 26-28, 2011) on our parking lot and under a tent. Ministers, led by Rev. Leon Wright, agreed to preach and teach to persons in the community and church disciples who participated in this worship experience. Persons passing by the service gravitated towards it as the Word of the Lord was lifted. Up. At least one, un-churched person joined our church after attending the Revival service. Many worshippers reported that they were blessed by the Revival experience. The ministerial staff recognizes that many more persons shall be blessed by this type of outdoor revival worship experience in the future.

Music Ministry

- Choir members sang carols at the Stoddard Baptist Home in Washington, DC on Dec 23rd.
- The Sanctuary Choir adopted 2 children for the Angel Tree Project; additionally the choir responded to an immediate need for a father and his six month old child who came by the church.

Nurse Ministry

- Participated in the Community Health Fair.
- Donated to the Angel Tree Project.

Prison Ministry

• Mount Moriah originally received 95 angels from the Prison Fellowship Ministry, 4 angels from Tyler & Brent Elementary School, 40 from DC Corrections, and 4 from telephone requests. After several attempts to make contact with parents and/or caretakers by telephone the final count for the completed Angel Tree Project for children served was **104**. Gifts for these children were purchased by various families of the church and given to the children at a special luncheon on December 18, 2011.

R.G. Williams Ministry

• Gave monetary donations to the St. Ann's Infant & Maternity Home and Hospital for Sick Children in Washington, DC.

Senior Usher Ministry

- Prepared ten food baskets for the needy and/or the sick and shut-in for the Christmas Holiday.
- Fully clothed a family with two children through the Annual Support-A-Child/Family project; also supplied the family with a food basket; additionally a family with one child that had special problems this year requested our assistance and the ministry gave a food basket, clothing and a toy for the Christmas Holiday.
- Provided the funds for the luncheon for the Angel Tree Project.
- Collected and turned in 13 cell phones to the Family Crisis Center; these phones will be refurbished by Verizon and put back into use with 3000 minutes to be used at the time of a crisis.

Senior Stars Ministry

• Supplied personal items to the homeless in two shelters. These items included: socks, hats, gloves, scarves, soap, deodorant, washcloths toothpaste, toothbrushes and body powder.

Scholarship Ministry

• Sponsored a "College Readiness Information Session" and the following schools were invited to attend: Easter Sr. H.S., Spingarn Sr. H.S., Phelps Architecture, Construction & Engineering H.S., Eliot-Hines Jr. H.S., Miner Elementary School, and Payne Elementary School.

Sunday Church School Ministry

• Church School volunteers distributed over 100 flyers and spoke with the neighbors in Mt. Moriah's community.

Trustee Ministry

• Served food with "Food & Friends" whose charge is to foster a community caring for men, women and children living with HIV/AIDS, cancer and other life-challenging illnesses by preparing and delivering specialized meals and groceries in conjunction with nutrition counseling.

Youth Ministry

- Outdoor Clean Up at Payne Elementary School, Washington, DC on April 30th; this opportunity to speak with youth playing on the playground and invite those who stopped by the clean-up to Mount Moriah.
- Served the homeless community at S.O.M.E. in Washington, DC on December 23rd; this opportunity allowed the youth to dialogue with other volunteers and spread the love of Jesus Christ wishing those they served holiday greetings.

Women's Ministry

• In December, the Women's Ministry partnered with a graduate student group at Wesley Theological Seminary to provide much needed items for children (age infant to 2 years) at the DC General Hospital Family Shelter. Items were delivered on Thursday, December 29. The following items were donated: Baby Wipes, Diapers, Bottles, Shampoo, Lotion, Bibs, Socks, Pacifiers, Spoons, Onesies, Coloring Books, 2pc Girls Outfit, 2pc Boys Outfit, Girl's Tees, Sleepers, Blankets, and Footies.
