

## **2012 Mt. Moriah Baptist Church Ministries Outreach Projects**

### **Audio, Drama, Envelope, Finance and Men's Ministries**

- \$228 to the Salvation Army specifically to purchase Safeway and Giant food cards to be made available to families in need at the Solomon G. Brown Center in Southeast, Washington, DC.
- Performed "hands on" outreach at the Salvation Army's Warehouse distribution center from 8:30am-4pm gathering and distributing gifts for their Angel Tree program.

### **Deacon Ministry**

- Provided assistance and visited St. Ann's Center for Family and Youth
- Donated to HSC Pediatric Center
- Donated to the Mt. Moriah Angel Tree Program

### **Deaconess Ministry**

- Picked up food products from Emery Church monthly for the Food Pantry; stocked shelves and filled bags with food to give out to needy Church and community families every fourth Thursday and whenever needed. An average of 40 persons is served each month.
- Purchased necessary items for the Food Pantry and Baptism Closet that were not issued on a regular schedule; for example, meats, towels, clothing and whatever and/or whenever we were short of any needed food or clothing item.
- Attended and assisted the GBDA with services at Stoddard Baptist Home.
- Supported the Angel Tree Project, Thanksgiving Basket, and Payne Elementary School supplies.

### **Dorcas Missionary Ministry**

- Prepared and distributed Christmas gifts to the residents of Carroll Manor Nursing Home during the December Fellowship Service.
- Organized and distributed over 100 Thanksgiving baskets to worthy recipients of the community.
- Participated in the Annual Community Day by distributing clothing to the needy in the church parking lot.
- Distributed clothing from the clothing closet on an at-need basis; on 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday mornings each month to shelters, accompanying the Evangelism Ministry; and on 4<sup>th</sup> Thursday of each month, accompanying the Deaconess Ministry.

### **Evangelism Ministry**

- Second Saturday of each month we ministered to and served food to the following Homeless Shelters in Washington, DC: Harriet Tubman Women's Center, Open Door Shelter for Women, CCNC Shelter, and John L. Young Center for Women.

### **Ministerial Staff**

- Twice during the year the ministerial staff paired up in teams and canvased/walked the neighborhood, up through Eliot-Hine Middle School area and over past the Stadium Armory Metro station, distributing “The Word For Today” to adults and youth.

### **Music Ministry**

- Sang and provided a worship service for the residents prepared and distributed Christmas gifts to the residents of Carroll Manor Nursing Home;

### **Prison Ministry**

- Mt. Moriah originally received 104 angels from the Prison Fellowship Ministry; 3 from Mount Moriah Baptist Church; and 40 from DC Department of Correction for a total of 147 angels. The final count after making contacts however was 93 children. The Angel Tree Program was held in December and the gifts were prepared by church disciples and were distributed; and lunch was served.

### **R.G. Williams Ministry**

- Monetary donations were given during the year to St. Ann’s Infant & Maternity Home and the HSC Pediatric Center

### **Senior Usher Ministry**

- Donated two turkeys to the ICUA “Randy L. Perrin Men’s Day” Committee Thanksgiving Basket Project
- Prepared ten food baskets for the needy for the Christmas holiday.
- Donated the funds for the Angel Tree Project luncheon.

### **Senior Stars Ministry**

- During the summer donated and prepared 125 toiletries bags (toothpaste, toothbrush, deodorant, wash cloths and soap) for the homeless shelters.
- Purchased gifts for the children to the Angel Tree Project.

### **Sunday Church School Ministry**

- Flyer Distribution – Volunteers from various classes distributed fliers in the neighborhood inviting them to Church School and worship service.
- Distributed goodies bag to first-time Church School visitors then and throughout the year.

### **Trustee Ministry**

- In April served at “Food & Friends” by preparing and delivering specialized meals and groceries to families living with HIV/AIDS, cancer and other life-challenging illnesses.

### **Youth Ministry**

- The youth visited the Crescent Cities Center (Nursing Home) in Riverdale, MD May 26, 2012. They presented a mini-program that ended with a fellowship with staff and residents.
- Youth girls, as part of the Women’s Day outreach activities, the women prepared food Friday, May 18<sup>th</sup> and served dinner on Saturday, May 19<sup>th</sup> to women at the Calvary Women’s Shelter on 6<sup>th</sup> Street, NW, Washington, DC.

**Women's Ministry/Women's Day**

- Partnered with a graduate student group at Wesley Theological Seminary to provide much needed items for children (age infant to 2 years) at the DC General Hospital Family Shelter. Items were delivered in April 2012.
- As part of the Women's Day outreach activities, the women prepared food Friday, May 18<sup>th</sup> and served dinner on Saturday, May 19<sup>th</sup> to women at the Calvary Women's Shelter on 6<sup>th</sup> Street, NW, Washington, DC. We purchased, cooked, packaged and served meals to about 10 women.
