Final School Improvement Report: Last year, BOE members were given SIC reports in pieces. The final report with all updates will be handed out to all members.

Spanish Immersion Sixth Grade scores on DCHS Spanish entrance exam: The report on our sixth grade's test results A range 0 students, B range 3 students, C range 2 students, D range 3 students, 86 and below-possibly Adv Spanish I or Spanish I 4 students. Tuition Transfer Grant: Total of 9 students who are on our Tuition Transfer Grant. SAS Celebrated our 105th Anniversary on June 24 in the parish Hall. Four new members will be inducted as SAS outstanding Alumni. Msgr. Chiodo—64, Frank Tursi—66, Ralph Marasco Sr.—55, Maxine Flaherty—66 and Ascension Vito—31 were honored. About 150 alumni attended.

Two exchange students coming to SAS from Guatemala in October-December Spanish Immersion in the middle school -the plan is to have SI student in grades 6 and 7 meet three days a week after school with a teacher. They will be involved in reading Spanish Literature, discuss, and journal through the year.

For the first time SAS will have a Student who hearing impaired: Ann Hiveley will be the incoming sign language interpreter, working with a 7th grader, Selena Estrada. Looking forward to working with Ann and Selena.

One to One Chromebook in the Middle School: For several years, SAS has been trying to upgrade our technology usage to our students. This fall, we will be initiating a 1 to 1 Chromebook program for students in the middle school. More info on these items will be discussed with the middle school students and parents in the fall. We want to thank the Kathy Coppola Foundation and Prairie Meadows for their contribution to make this happen.

Middle School class Schedule Changes: Due to numbers and the teaching schedule, the middle school daily schedule will eliminate block scheduling and introduce 48-minute classes. Classes will meet almost every day. Added to the schedule is a resource period just before lunch so students can do homework or seek help from another teacher. Need for two members of BOE to be part of the following committees:

Each committee meets once a month (Wednesday) at 7:30 am in the library.

f. Five Year Strategic Plan: Dr. Joe Cordaro: School Improvement Committee Review: Mission: All students and classes are St Anthony school and remove the Spanish Immersion program name, implement bilingual masses (Spanish and English) for students preparing school wide masses.

Review and change wording: Ensure prayer is occurring three times daily: morning lunch and closing. Review and change possibly do announcements on intercom and pray in individual classrooms. High priority: embrace the way other families and students from diverse nationalities cultures and/or heritages express and live their faith. Changed wording: copy of the Diocese of Des Moines Curriculum Guidelines/Iowa Core available in both school and parish websites in English and Spanish. Promote visibility of pastoral team at school through invitation to classes and events. Keep log of visits throughout the year. B: Academics High priority restructure instructional time and facilities (smaller group, additional teachers) to provide additional time and focus to math and science instruction. Ensure that the middle school Spanish immersion curriculum aligns with the standards of the lowa Core. Increase teacher/student access to technology that supports the curriculum and the skill development of the students. Review/Change: wording to something like this: Increase teacher/student access to technology curriculum or technology teacher that supports the curriculum and the skill development of the students (we have no curriculum-how to teach Microsoft Word, Excel, PowerPoint, etc. to teach kids 21st century skills. We really need a technology curriculum for all grades to teach students keyboarding skill and program skills and/or a technology teacher) Personnel High Priority: suggested positions to be added, however not limited to: Instructional coach/data team leader, Technology Teacher, Assistant principal, Curriculum leader, Spanish Title 1/Reading Recovery But Change to Technology Teacher, Spanish Title 1/Reading Recovery, Instructional Coach/Data Team Leader, Assistant Principal, and Curriculum leader. Continue practice of assigning new hire teacher with mentor teacher. (For this point, we would like to also see a "Teacher Handbook" to provide all teachers, especially new teachers, with basic information about the ins and outs of St. Anthony School) Foster meaningful peer observations among teachers to promote best practice in teaching.
