## LOOKING FOR THE IDEAL LEADERSHIP

## WHAT SHOULD WE BE LOOKING FOR IN A LEADER

So, what should we be looking for in a leader? Should we expect him/her to be religious? If so how religious? What religion do we prefer and what religion do we not prefer?

Do we want him/her to be married? Is there a problem if there has been a divorce? Are we looking for his leadership to restore the nation economically, morally, and emotionally? Do we want him/her to be involved in some of the world crises? Do we want our President to be more occupied with things here at home? Do we want our military to be strong? Is there a concern about our National Debt, Social Security, and Healthcare?

Are we expecting too much out of our President? Should Congress take a more active role in how our nation is run? Should the President set the agenda as to what problems the government needs to address and then make his/her recommendations as to how to resolve them? These type of questions I believe should be considered when making a choice for leadership.

Too often we expect our leaders to be miracle workers. We want them to take office and immediately get the job done-for that is why we have elected them. The problem is that is not how it works. Our leaders must contend with the media who also have an agenda who have more access to the public than the President does. Then there will always be the opposition party that will seldom agree with whoever is in office. Now with this there are various organizations with money who also have an agenda and they too tend to bring pressure on the leader of our nation who is supposed to represent all citizens.

The President always represents our nation around the world. The world governments are far more diverse than even our people within our nation. Not every nation believes in democracy, prosperity of its citizens, and freedom of speech. The evil influence around the world is one that the leader of our nation must deal with, reason with, and use his influence to provide greater freedom for the people of the world.

All of the above should tell us whoever we elect needs our prayers as we are told in the Holy Scriptures. It was in the Apostle Paul's letter to Timothy when he wrote:

"I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks, be made for all men; For kings, and for all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty. For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Saviour; Who will have all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowledge of the truth." 1 Timothy 2:2-4

There is another thing that we should consider and that is what the Holy Scriptures says about government. "Let everyone be subject to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God." Romans 13:1 NIV. Therefore, as Christians we need at all times to show our respect for whoever is in office. We may not ever agree with them politically but when they hold such an office we must show respect to the person that holds that office. Such respect will enable Christians to have more influence on the people that hold that office than those who claim they voted for that particular person.

Let it be said of us Christians, especially in the years that come, what Pilate said of Christ, the man that rendered the judgment of crucifixion; he said of the Christ, "I find no fault in Him." This was said of a man who was falsely accused, maligned, miss-quoted, striped and beaten by the soldiers, etc. Yet Christ's behavior was so perfect that even Pilate could find no fault in Him.

Of late many of our Christian brethren have got involved in the political process. I understand their reasoning due to the abortion issue, same-sex marriage, transgender bathrooms, the economy, etc. But nevertheless we need the wisdom of God in how to address these issues while at the same time still doing our mission in reaching the lost for Jesus Christ. In the meantime, let us start dealing with these issues down on our knees in prayer so that we may lead a peaceable life in godliness and honesty.
