FINDING THE ACCEPTABLE WORDS

"The preacher sought to find out acceptable words: and that which was written was upright, even words of truth." Eccl. 12:10

Whenever we who are writers attempt to put pen to paper for our target audience it is most often challenging to find the best appropriate words to convey what we are trying to say to our readers. We do not always succeed in writing the sentence, paragraph, or even the entire article the way that we originally had in mind when we started. I am always happy to have my wife, and on occasions my office secretaries and staff, help me in the proof reading of these articles. They have saved me on various occasions from not only errors in my grammar and English, but also in producing a better way of saying what I was attempting to convey to my audience.

Our articles, as a minister of the Gospel, most often make use of the Holy Scriptures. Who can improve on the Holy Scriptures? However, not everyone is heavenly or Spiritually minded so we try from time to time to put something in our writing like a fisherman does with his bait to attract a fish that may be swimming by. Back in the sixties a man named John Wanamaker, who was known to be very successful in business related that when he was only eleven years of age he purchased a Bible in a little mission Sunday School for \$2.75 which he paid for in small installments. In the later years of his life he is known to have said this of his purchase: "Looking back at my life I see that it was that little red Book that was the foundation on which my life has been built, and the thing that has made possible all that has counted in my life. I know now that it was the greatest investment, the most important and far reaching purchase I ever made."

Therefore, knowing what **John Wanamaker** found to be true for his life, as well as that of most of my readers, the question I want address is: *Why is it that so many, both in the church and out of the church seem to avoid reading this book as well as avoid hearing from God's Word*?
