Read the Bible as ONE Story

God's rescue through Jesus is the unifying story of all 66 books of the Bible.

Genesis 3:15 promises a Rescuer and the rest of the Bible fills in the details. Jesus is the main point of the entire Bible. Pastor Yancey Arrington shows that this was Jesus' own view of the Old Testament, *"In Luke 24, Jesus was walking with men on the road to Emmaus... These men doubted the resurrection, and Jesus could have just shown them His face, but instead He showed them Himself by teaching them the Old Testament!"*

If we read the Bible as the fulfillment of Genesis 3:15, we will see that all of it is about Jesus. Every text of the Bible is about the work of Christ. Every text is either explicitly promising that He will come, or foreshadowing His provision. Every hero of the Old Testament shows us his need and our need for the true Redeemer.

This Bible Reading Plan is designed to help you read the Bible as one story.

The READ THE STORY sections are primarily narrative portions of scripture. These are arranged so you can follow scripture chronologically.

The UNDERSTAND THE STORY sections are primarily explanatory sections of scripture. These will help you connect the dots between the shadows of Christ and His later fulfillments.

The RESPOND TO THE STORY sections are mostly praise, poetry, and wisdom literature. These show us how to respond to God's revelation with emotion, prayer, and action.

If you read the 24 daily reading portions each month you will complete 90% of the Bible in a year. For those that want to make sure they have read every chapter of the Bible, additional reading portions are added at the bottom of each page.

Try this process to study the Bible in community or alone.

If you are seeking to read the entire Bible in a year, you will not have time to study each passage in detail. However, set aside some portions of scripture for more in-depth study and prayer.

1) PRAY

Ask the Holy Spirit to teach you and change you.

2) OBSERVE

Observe the text. Read it and re-read it. Answer who, what, when, where, why, and how questions of the passage. Is there a structure? What is the context?

3) INTERPRET

Interpret what it says about God or the condition of mankind. Is there any mention of grace? Is our need of it implied? Are there any cross references to consider? Why was this portion written? How do other portions of scripture help to interpret this one? What do gifted teachers say about this text? How can I understand this passage in a way that makes more of Jesus?

4) APPLY

Consider how to **apply** the scripture to daily life. Are there any commands to obey, examples to follow, or promises to trust? Does the passage expose any error in my beliefs or behavior? How does the text lead me to interact with others? What is the passage calling me to do?

5) PRAY

Pray over the contents of the text and their application.

Choosing A Bible Translation

The Bible is a divinely unified story of redemption in the form of multiple books. These books are written in different genres, cultures, eras, and styles. The good news of Jesus Christ is an unchanging message that is constantly translated into new languages and cultures. African scholar Lamin Sanneh says, “The original language of Christianity is translation.” Grace Bible Church uses the **ESV**; however, we are not convinced that it is the *only* translation people should read. We give thanks that we have a great heritage of scholars seeking to translate the Bible into the language of the common people. This same desire to make God’s word understandable motivated Jerome and the King James Version translators. In the words of the King James translators’ preface, “Translation it is that openeth the window, to let in the light.” The same drive to share God’s Word compels modern scholars to translate the Bible today. Below are some guidelines for choosing a Bible.

First, what *type* of translation do you prefer? There are three kinds:

1. **Word-for-word** literal translations
2. **Thought-for-thought** literal translations
3. Paraphrases (not usually referred to as a “translation”)

Make your primary Bible a literal translation (type 1 or 2).

1. **Word-for-word** translations include: ESV (English Standard Version), NASB (New American Standard Bible), NKJV (New King James Version), HCSB (Holman Christian Standard Bible), and KJV (King James Version).
2. **Thought-for-thought** translations (also called dynamic-equivalence) include: NIV (New International Version), NET (New English Translation), NLT (New Living Translation), and The Voice.
3. **Paraphrases** include: The Message, The Living Bible, J.B. Phillips. These are often helpful, but more like reading a sermon or a commentary than reading a Bible.

Choosing A Bible Translation, Continued

When choosing between a word-for-word and a thought-for-thought translation, think about your personal reading preferences and experience. The goal is to read it!

If you want smooth reading that flows like a conversation, you may prefer a thought-for-thought translation. The trade-off is that the translators are making more interpretive decisions to smooth out the language. If you are a reader of old books, you may prefer the precision of a word-for-word translation. The NET combines thought-for-thought translation with exhaustive linguistic notes to clarify translation choices.

Take time to familiarize yourself with the philosophy of the translators. Compare favorite passages and try to understand why the translations differ. Read the prefaces to understand what their goals were. Trendy preferences like “gender-inclusive language” can influence the philosophy of the translators. This effects all modern translations to varying degrees.

There are also many “Study” Bibles that have explanations at the bottom of each page, as well as helpful summaries and introductions. Two of the best study bibles available today are the “*NIV Study Bible*” and the “*ESV Study Bible*.” The “*Gospel Transformation Bible*” is a new one that focuses on Gospel-centered application of each book of the Bible.

No matter which Bible you choose, come to the scriptures needy, and ask God to meet you there: “Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied.” Matthew 5:6
