PURPOSE SUMMARY

The Lead Pastor will provide spiritual leadership to the congregation and general oversight to the ministries and programs of the church in line with our vision of helping people to begin, belong and become.

GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES/AUTHORITIES

Reporting Relationships: Reports to the Council of First Christian Reformed Church.

Gospel Proclamation

- The Lead Pastor's joy will be to proclaim the gospel of Jesus Christ and administer the sacraments so that all are called to turn to Him in ever-increasing faith, hope, and love. The Lead Pastor will be the primary preacher for regular worship services and special worship services in accordance with a schedule in agreement with the elders.
- The Lead Pastor will root the groups and ministries he oversees in biblical and confessional teaching.
- The Lead Pastor will collaborate with the Associate Pastor to equip the church for reaching the Crown Point community with the gospel of Jesus Christ.
- The Lead Pastor's life will model the church's vision to encourage people to:
 - Begin a relationship with God through Jesus Christ
 - Belong to Christ and His body, the church
 - Become mature followers of Christ who bring others to Christ
 - through *spiritual growth*
 - expressed in service.

Leadership for Strategic Ministry Planning and Execution

- The Lead Pastor will lead the council in defining/clarifying vision and strategic ministry goals.
- The Lead Pastor will lead the staff in coordinating the work of ministry by:
 - Meeting regularly with the Associate Pastor to ensure that staffing, ministry programs and activities, facilities, and policies are effectively aligned to meet strategic goals.
 - Coordinating/leading weekly staff meetings, director meetings, and other activities to clarify and execute goals and objectives.
 - Providing ongoing leadership and ministry training opportunities.
 - Conducting annual formal performance evaluations and providing ongoing informal performance feedback.

Pastoral Care

The Lead Pastor will oversee the pastoral care needs of the congregation and, as necessary, share with the
Associate Pastor and elders in hospital visitation and member visits. Also, the Lead Pastor will share with the
Associate Pastor in counseling, marriages, and funerals.

Additional Administration

• The Lead Pastor will participate in meetings of the council, elders, executive and congregation.
