Reverend Davis is affiliated with many religious organizations throughout the metropolitan area. He is a member of the Missionary Baptist Ministers Conference of Washington, D.C. and Vicinity, the Hearing Committee and is a member of the Wednesday Morning Prayer Breakfast.

Pastor Davis is punctual, humble, kind and loving to his family and Church Family. He constantly talks about the wife that the Lord gave him and how much he loves her. He is a man of love and always greets people with a holy kiss. He lives by what he preaches and teaches. He gives all the glory to God. Mt. Zion members thank God for sending him to them.

Reverend Davis is 95 years old and the Oldest Living Active Minister in the Metropolitan area.
