Thriving or Treading Water?

The first stage of our search for a new pastor (target transition: April 2018) is to take the time needed to pause and reflect -- who are we, where have we come from, where are we going, what's God's Dream to take us if we just had the courage and love? Trinity's freshly minted call team (Crystal Nunnenkamp + 15 lay leaders + staff) has started work on a "Congregational Self-study" provided by Paul Linnemann, our Northwest District president. Your input is needed, desired and important. Here is an excerpt from page 4:

"Congregations tend to fall into three general categories: Thriving, Treading Water, or Legacy. Take a minute to consider which best applies to our situation. Chances are you'll find yourself somewhere in between the three."

Thriving

These congregations are 1) highly relational. They are 2) engaged with their communities, providing 3) multiple entry points by which people who aren't a part of the congregation can enter. They are characterized by 4) strong lay leaders who take the initiative for ministry and work in partnership with the staff. They are 5) strategic -- they have short term and long range plans by which they seek to fulfill 6) Jesus' mission for His church. [recall Paul Mueller's insight: "The church does not have a mission; Jesus' mission has a church."] Their central focus is on 7) sharing the Gospel and connecting people to the life giving message of God's love and eternal life in Jesus.

Treading Water

These congregations 1) focus on programs they offer. They 2) rely heavily on their staff to initiate and drive these efforts. Congregations in this category may have a past history of ministry in their community, but there is 3) growing anxiety that what they once had is slipping away. This sometimes leads to 5) tensions between different "church camps" about what should be done. They tend to 6) operate in isolation of their communities. Life in these congregations isn't bad, but even on their best days they are just 7) "treading water" and expending most of their energy on themselves to just stay in place. They have a terrible "sinking feeling". Turn the dial 20 years. Where will they be?

Legacy

These congregations are in basic survival mode. They face a steadily declining membership and declining financial and people resources. The people feel like "it's only a matter of time" before they will have to close.

Of the three categories described above, which seems to best fit our situation?

I trust we're not in the legacy category... yet. Just the same, we need to be deeply concerned about what spiritual legacy we're leaving to the next generations -- our kids, our grandkids, our community. Is the way we model **Following Jesus, Living the Gospel and "Doing Church"** attractive to millennials, Gen Z and people outside Jesus' family? Do we speak their language? Do we understand their heart concerns? Or are we just waiting around for non-Christians to show up Sunday morning at our building (attractional model)? Are we intentionally Following Jesus outside our walls (missional = go out to the river, Acts 16:3) in such a way that non-Christians hear the Gospel and discover **a life-changing encounter** with the living God? Giving people food for their belly and shoes for their feet reflects Jesus' preference for the poor and glorifies God but how can the Spirit lead us to do it as Jesus did -- in a way that **the Spirit touches their soul and changes their standing in eternity** before God? We must always be pressing into the Finke challenge: Good >> Better >> Best.

Each of us will evaluate Trinity's present state according to our unique perception and involvement. It's exciting that Trinity, Hillsboro is taking the Finke, Mengstead, Mueller and Rumsch challenge seriously. We have many, many capably lay-led teams (50+) functioning on multiple levels of our congregational life. Think 100th Anniversary leaders, Alpha discussion leaders, Life Group leaders, CrossRoads leaders, Family Promise leaders, HomePlate leaders, VBS leaders, etc. It's exciting to announce the birth of a dynamic new Mission Outreach team. Their job will be to follow up and expand on our recent Mission Festival Sundays.

Trinity is an exciting place to be and is thriving on multiple levels. Our stated mission vision is to live out Phil. 2: 3-5: to focus not on ourselves but others and deepen our love and engagement with our community. That's strategic. Take a glance at the Community Challenge Tree. Be proud of what God's Spirit is doing in and through us. Truth is we've only just begun "to live, move, and have our being" in the Easter Effect. We've been changed forever. Let's embrace and "become the change" Jesus redeemed us to be *for the sake of others* and build a beautiful legacy that changes lives now and lasts into eternity.

In addition to those shipped, 4 regular size and 2 baby quilts went with Christmas baskets, 4 regular and 2 baby to Family Promise and 5 baby quilts to Love, INC. The quilters continue to average completing 3 quilts on a work day, chalking up 723 hours this period from October 29, 2016 to May 5, 2017. There was that unfortunate happening that interfered with our work – the flood. Looking on the bright side, it made us get organized.

The quilt donated to FHLCS for their auction was a combined effort. The completed top was given to us, we provided the back, Karen Walker furnished the batting and quilted it using her long-arm quilting machine and we finished the edge with binding.

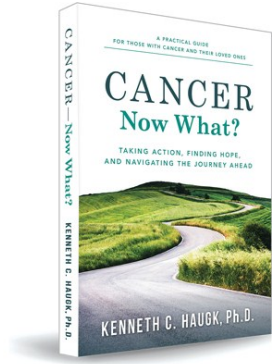


Hillsboro Hops Tickets

CANCER Now What?

Taking Action, Finding Hope, and Navigating the Journey Ahead

By Kenneth C. Haug, Ph.D.

This is a practical Guide for those with Cancer and their loved one. The basic purpose is to provide those diagnosed with cancer and their loved ones with knowledge and practical ideas for dealing with cancer.

*There are 74 chapters, each about 3-5 pages divided into 12 Parts. Part I for instance, **What Do I Do Now?** includes suggestions in a chapter of "Telling Others about the Cancer Diagnosis" (Chapter 5) and Part 2, **Dealing with the Emotional Dimension of Cancer** includes feelings, "The Emotional Aftershocks of a Cancer Diagnosis" (Chapter 6). A later Chapter gives ideas of "Medical Questions to Ask and When to Ask Them" (Chapter 13) and "Don't Let Cancer Define You" (Chapter 38).*

Your Stephens Ministry Team at Trinity is reading and studying this brand new book published in 2017 to be a help to those challenged by a Cancer diagnosis. It is also in our Church Library for you to review. What to say, how to be a friend to those who do not know what to say in these times; these are just a couple of the many areas this wonderful book on encouragement work within the informational chapters.

I suggest you take a look at this book, maybe review a chapter or two of areas that interest you, especially if you know someone near and dear that has cancer.

*CANCER Now What also has a **Giver's Guide** that has ideas for giving the book to those with Cancer and their loved ones. Tips for giving or sending the book, suggestions of what to say when giving the book in person, and answers to frequently asked questions are contained in this **Giver's Guide**.*
