Confessions of a Wanna-be Disciple

"Follow Jesus – Reach, Grow, Go – Real Life, with Real People"; this has been our purpose/mission statement for the past number of years. It is the guiding principle that will lead us into our next 100 years. But to do so, we need to know exactly what it is we are saying with that little phrase.

What does it mean to be a follower of Jesus? In the Scriptures we find several different categories of individuals associated with Jesus: interested people, followers, disciples, and apostles. "Apostle" was a specific term that Jesus used for His closest disciples. "Disciple" was a term used for those followers who heard Jesus' call to follow Him and actually did. "Followers" were generally those who saw Jesus as interesting – someone who had reached "celebrity" status – or those who were looking for a deliverer from oppression, and maybe Jesus would be the one. "Interested people", were just curious by-standers.

So what is Jesus looking for from us – certainly a follower – but more, He wants us to be disciples. To be faithful to the intent and meaning of our purpose/mission statement, Jesus is looking for DISCIPLES.

Greg Finke in his new book: "Joining Jesus, Show Me How" offers this definition of a disciple. "A disciple follows Jesus: in order to become *like* Jesus (through baptism *into* Jesus and training *by* Jesus); so that he/she can participate *with* Jesus on His mission as a daily lifestyle; and show others how to do the same." (pg.91, "Joining Jesus, Show Me How") We find out how Jesus trained disciples, what it means to follow Him, and how to share Jesus while joining Him on His mission, all of this in the Gospels.

This fall, as a part of our ongoing participation in being followers and wanna-be disciples of Jesus, we will be taking a closer look at the Greg Finke's new book, as well as refreshing our understanding of the principles of his first book: "Joining Jesus on His Mission". Through Bible Studies, small group discussions, sermon messages, "on the job doing", we will discover together that being a disciple of Jesus is at the same time not an easy thing, and as easy as everyday conversation. But beware, this is not just training, this is doing. As preparation, chose your favorite Gospel, or any of the Gospels, and make it your goal to read through it at least twice this summer. We get to know Jesus through where we find him – in the Gospels.
