500th Anniversary of the Reformation



This year, 2017, marks the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation. In 1517 Luther posted the 95 theses (topics for debate) on the Castle Church door in Wittenberg. Luther never started out to form a new Church, in fact he did not like people calling themselves "Lutherans". We are all followers of Christ, he insisted. But as he studied the Scriptures he saw where the Church had not been faithful, and he wished to "reform" the Church.

This fall, Trinity will celebrate the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation in a special service on October 29th. This is a one service Sunday. We will also be looking at Luther and his times and his message, and the ongoing reformation that continues today because of his work. A three part study of Luther: the Man, the Moment, and the Movement, begins October 15th on Sunday mornings.

It has been awhile since I've shared anything concerning the CrossRoads Journey we are on. With the final plans for the 100th Anniversary Celebration almost complete, it's time to consider what's next?

What's next in many ways has already been happening. With our CrossRoads Journey "Case Statement" we identified 3 key objectives: to enhance our mission and ministry; to complete our initial site plan by adding a sanctuary; and to strengthen our stewardship ministry here at Trinity.

The financial deficit that necessitated our releasing of Lori Campbell as our Church Secretary is very real. The CrossRoads Journey team along with the Stewardship Team are working on ways to increase our stewardship awareness and response to the gracious giving evidenced in God's faithfulness to us.

Have you ever considered this question as it might relate to God: what do you give the guy who has everything? Because God really does have everything. He is the creator, sustainer, provider for all of His creation. So what does He ask from us. In some regards, nothing. From another perspective He calls us to be faithful managers of all He has given to us - individually and corporately. But ultimately He simply asks us to "love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength, and to love our neighbor as we love ourselves".

This fall each of us needs to look at our lives and ask: am I loving God in all I do and say with all He has created me to be? And how about "my neighbor" - everyone else?

This past July, 250 High School students descended upon Portland for theONE Gathering. Twelve of them came from Trinity. It was an absolutely amazing experience. The goal of this gathering was to give students a community where God's Word is openly and honestly studied, see the world that needs a savior, and give them the tools they need to meet the challenges they face on their own and away from home. We accomplished this and so much more. There was morning Bible study, worship, speakers, comedians, illusionists, bouncy houses, archery tag, and of course, service. Every day we went out to the greater Portland area and just served. We ranged from picking berries, to sanding wood, painting sheds, homeless ministry, packing food and pulling nails. The range of projects was great, but the need in our neighborhoods is even greater.

One of the coolest moments for me was our first service projects on Thursday. We had driven back out to Hillsboro (I thought it was funny that they sent the lone Hillsboro church back to Hillsboro), to pick berries for Friendly House. They assist in many things but specifically senior citizens unable to care for themselves and also have a preschool which they use the proceeds from the berries they make into jam to run the school. They are doing wonderful work in the community. I was chatting with the lady overseeing our group and she asked why we came to help them. I simply explained that we are at a youth gathering at Concordia with a bunch of high school students from all over the Northwest district that came to Portland to serve. She gave me this perplexed look and replied, "A bunch of high school kids want to just serve?" She was in utter disbelief that students actually cared enough to make a difference in the world around them. Her heart was changed in that moment. Mine was as well because I got to share an experience with someone completely unchurched, completely removed from the body of Christ and invite her into our life. She joined us for a brief moment on a scorching hot Thursday afternoon joining Jesus in His mission.



This trip was profound, inspiring, and encouraging. I ask that you talk about it with any of the students that attended. Thank you for your prayers and for all of your support.

Let's Go Deeper

My time here at Trinity has been tasked with rebuilding the youth program, giving junior high and high school students a place to belong and have fun, all while growing their faith in Jesus. Relationships have been my sole focus, relationships with each other and more importantly, their relationship with Jesus. The youth program has seen immense progress these last few years, but I've felt like there is more we can do. This fall, Trinity's youth program is going to go deeper. This will be done with a few minor changes to how we are set up. Right now youth group on Wednesday nights are geared towards games, snacks, and lessons. A perfectly fine model that gets most youth excited to come and have a good time being a part of this group. However, it's a bit shallow. I want to bring students into a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ and cultivate their relationships with each other in lasting ways. Our current system could use some help accomplishing that. I think most of this stems from a heart of worship. As it is right now, most of our students don't get reached on Sundays. Some of this is because of sports or other time commitments, maybe parents want a day off or the students are just not engaging with the service. There are many varieties of reasons they are not coming on Sundays, but they do come on Wednesdays. And that is something I can work with.

My goal and aim for this year is to create a deeper faith culture within the student ministry. Wednesday nights will be shifting to 7-9p. The first hour will be worship, a message, and breaking into small groups. This will help students give praise and honor to God, model a healthy church life, and come together as peers to discuss, wrestle, and ponder the scriptures. We are going to meet students where they're at, wherever that may be and give them a place to belong, to be loved, and to become who they truly are. The second hour will be the usual fun and games with snacks. If students want to play dodgeball they can, if a student just wants to chow down on six bags of chips they can. The second half of the night is for connection, however that may look like. These changes will not take place right away as we are not set up for it quite yet, but will soon.

We are rebranding our group, increasing our social media presence, creating high school coffee shop Bible studies, fun events for junior high students, lock-ins, trips, and monthly service projects for all students. This task will be the greatest thing I've undertaken here at Trinity and I can't do it alone. Not only am I going to need help with music (instruments & singing), I need people to run projector and sound, small group leaders, chaperones for events, and a team around me to give me support and to keep me accountable. This is not some ploy to beg people to help me, this is an invitation to join the amazing things happening in our student ministry. If you feel at all called to work with youth please have a conversation with me. If you feel you'd like to join, but not sure how, come have a conversation with me. It's more than just hanging with students and being the young, "hip" guy. There are so many possibilities to get you plugged in and students are looking for the connection with the greater body of Christ. That's what I'm trying to do here. If we give students good worship, a message that applies to their life, and ways to serve their faith, we will grow this ministry. I'm ready to do the work that God has placed in front of us, are you?

Exodus 3:4-14 A STUDY ON RELUCTANCE

⁴When the LORD saw that he had gone over to look, God called to him from within the bush, "Moses! Moses!" And Moses said, "Here I am." ⁵"Do not come any closer," God said. "Take off your sandals, for the place where you are standing is holy ground." ⁶Then he said, "I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob." At this, Moses hid his face, because he was afraid to look at God. ⁷The LORD said, "I have indeed seen the misery of my people in Egypt. I have heard them crying out because of their slave drivers, and I am concerned about their suffering. ⁸So I have come down to rescue them from the hand of the Egyptians and to bring them up out of that land into a good and spacious land, a land flowing with milk and honey—the home of the Canaanites, Hittites, Amorites, Perizzites, Hivites and Jebusites. ⁹And now the cry of the Israelites has reached me, and I have seen the way the Egyptians are oppressing them. ¹⁰So now, go. I am sending you to Pharaoh to bring my people the Israelites out of Egypt." ¹¹But Moses said to God, "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?" ¹²And God said, "I will be with you. And this will be the sign to you that it is I who have sent you: When you have brought the people out of Egypt, you will worship God on this mountain." ¹³Moses said to God, "Suppose I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' Then what shall I tell them?" ¹⁴God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: 'I AM has sent me to you.'"

Exodus 4:13-16

¹³But Moses said, "Pardon your servant, Lord. Please send someone else." ¹⁴Then the LORD's anger burned against Moses and he said, "What about your brother, Aaron the Levite? I know he can speak well. He is already on his way to meet you, and he will be glad to see you. ¹⁵You shall speak to him and put words in his mouth; I will help both of you speak and will teach you what to do. ¹⁶He will speak to the people for you, and it will be as if he were your mouth and as if you were God to him.

THE APPROACH (Ex. 3:4-6)

- Having seen a bush on fire yet unconsumed by it, Moses encountered the presence and call of God from the bush.
- Moses responded to the encounter with reverent fear, hiding his face.

THE ASSIGNMENT (Ex. 3:7-10)

- God stated that He had heard the prayers of His suffering people and revealed that He was about to act on their behalf.
- God also revealed that He would use Moses as an instrument in the deliverance of the Hebrews.

THE AUTHORITY (Ex. 3:11-14)

- To answer Moses' reluctance to obey His call, God revealed to Moses His covenant name and promised to be with Moses.

THE ASSURANCE (Ex. 4:13-16)

- After presenting reasons why he was not fit for the job, Moses asked God to send someone else to do the job.
- God assured Moses of His assistance, including using Aaron to speak for Moses when needed.
