THE RE-FORMATION TODAY

What a unique time in history! Here it is Trinity's 100^{th} Anniversary as a congregation, and the 500^{th} Anniversary of the Reformation. Both are momentous occasions, and each in its own way speaks about the power of God to re-form.

Trinity today is not the same Trinity of 1917. Over this past year of celebration, and especially at the service on September 24th, we have seen how God continues to change us, to motivate us, to re-form us into what it means to be a follower of Jesus. As we begin our second 100 years, we again see God re-forming us through the CrossRoads Journey and three prime objectives. It is safe to say that the Trinity of 2017 will not be the same Trinity of 2117, especially if Jesus returns before then.

But 2017 is also the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation. In 1517 a monk named Martin Luther, with a number of associates, sought to bring change to the Church of their day. What transpired was a re-formation of the Church and a greater focus on being a disciple of Jesus. The Church of Luther's day had lost sight of what it meant to learn from Jesus and His Word, and then take that Word out to share with others, re-forming them into disciples as well. It seems that 500 years later the re-formation is still needed.

Greg Finke in his book, "Joining Jesus Show Me How", describes a disciple as: "A disciple follows Jesus: in order to become like Jesus (through baptism into Jesus and training by Jesus); so that he/she can participate with Jesus on His mission as a daily lifestyle; and show others how to do the same." (JJSMH pg.91) Are we disciples of Jesus? Does our daily lifestyle reflect Jesus? How are we at showing others how to be disciples also? These are haunting questions, at least to me, as I consider my discipleship.

What about you, how is your discipleship? Are there areas of your life that you would like to see re-formed? What is it in the next year, the next month, the next week, the next day, that you can do to be ready for Jesus' re-forming of your life? Is it a greater awareness of God's presence in your life each day; is it a (continued on next page)

greater excitement about worship, corporate and individual; is it a consistent, intentional study of God's word; is it a growing desire to be a good steward/manager of the resources God has given you; is it a continuation of the 100 hours of "community service" begun during our 100th Anniversary? All of this, and much more simply prepares us, enables us, and informs us of the re-forming power of God in our lives each day.

The apostle Paul wrote in Romans 12:1, 2; "I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." Re-formation.
