## PAST OUR EXCUSES & INSECURITIES

The story of Moses has come up in my life quite a few times recently. Mainly, his encounter with God in the burning bush. Moses, being a shepherd at that time, was tending his father-in-law’s flock and notices a bush that was on fire, but did not burn up. His curiosity led him to the bush. Anticipation, expectation filling his mind, and there the bush speaks, “Moses! Moses!” to which Moses replies, “Here I am.” His answer is not necessarily what I would do. I’d probably run if a bush called my name! Yet Moses, answers “Here I am.” I think when God comes to us in this form, there is a familiarity. We recognize God like the true father he is to us.

God speaks such great words to Moses telling him he is the God of his ancestors. That he has heard Israel’s cries and he will come down to rescue them. Then God gives Moses his task: go to Pharaoh and bring my people out of Egypt. Moses’ response is one I think many of us answer when God calls: “Who am I that should do that?” “Who do I even say sent me?”

God’s response was this: “I AM WHO I AM”—Yahweh. With these words, he speaks that he is everything. All things. One simple word, Yahweh, tells us so much about who God is. God turns Moses’ staff into a snake and gives him leprosy on his hand as signs of God’s power. I would be so amazed to see this. Yet Moses responds, “O Lord, I am slow of speech and tongue.” Moses gives the excuse that he has a speech impediment. That he stutters. This is his response to God’s call: I don’t talk well, so I can’t do that. This is a huge insecurity that Moses has. Is this really the Moses we read about in Exodus? Because the Moses I remember was fearless, not this worrisome stutterer.

How often do we hear God’s call and give an excuse? I can’t do that God because I’m too busy, I don’t make enough money, people won’t listen to me, I’m not strong enough, that’s not one of my gifts, I’m not equipped to do something like that. How often do we let >>

>> our insecurities rule over us that when God calls, we make an excuse? I think there is a bit of Moses in all of us. We don't think we're good enough for the task ahead. We second guess God who made us his first pick. We all struggle with this at some point .

This story really resonates with me because like Moses, I too, have a speech impediment. You may not have ever noticed, but growing up r's were hard for me. I was a real-life Elmer Fudd. If you haven't noticed this problem, that's because I worked hard to be able to say my r's. So, when I read the story of Moses, I see myself. A man with talent, sure, but an insecurity with how I talk. God has called me to a place where I speak a lot and I questioned at first, but I trusted that God had this all figured out. I wouldn't be at Trinity today without God calling me past my insecurities and excuses into ministry.

Where is God calling you? Are you still waiting for your burning bush moment? When it comes, are you going to make excuses or answer the call? When we trust God, he shows up.

## Call Committee Update

Dear brothers and sisters of Trinity,

We are now just a mere six months away from Pastor Bruce's retirement. Although working silently in the background, you can rest assured the call committee has been hard at work. The committee held their first meeting in May, and has had two meetings a month since that time. Nomination forms for possible pastoral candidates were requested from the congregation in June and were sent along with the congregational self study (that was presented to the congregation at the meeting on June 10th) to the District office. The District reviewed our nomination forms, and returned information to the call committee with fifteen viable candidate names. That list of names was prayed for and each candidate's information carefully reviewed. After further prayer, the committee narrowed down the list of possible candidates to seven. Those select seven pastors were mailed a letter advising them that they are being considered for a possible Call to Trinity. The candidates were also asked to respond to a questionnaire that was carefully crafted by the committee to gain additional information about the candidates thoughts on Trinity specific issues, i.e. women elders. We are currently waiting for complete return of those responses. We have been working diligently in our efforts in our search for our next pastor, and the committee is hopeful to begin video/telephone interviews by early December. We will have another update for you at the congregational meeting December 10th. In the meantime, we ask that you keep the call committee and the pastors on our candidate list in your daily prayers.

### Thanksgiving Meal

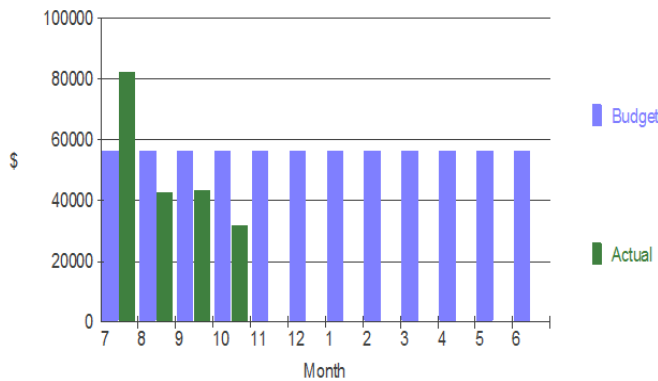

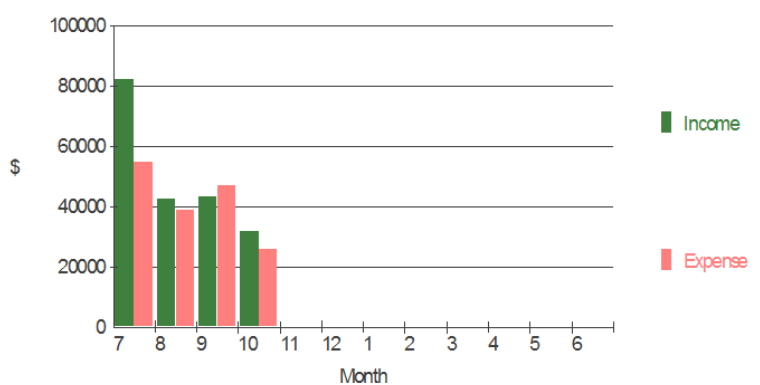
### By the Numbers - Year to Date

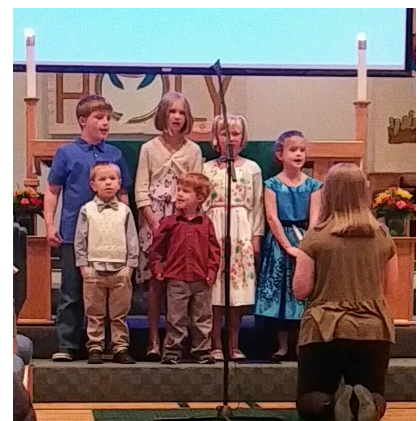

## Altar Guild Committee

Now that the 100th anniversary celebration has ended there may be many of you who have empty hours to fill and are looking for opportunities to help with other programs of Trinity Lutheran Church. One area we would like you to consider for service is the Altar Guild. The purpose of the Altar Guild is to serve and requires spiritual commitment. At Trinity this includes making certain the altar paraments are the right color for the season of the church year, filling and setting the vessels for Holy Communion on the altar on the first and third Sundays of the month, and cleaning up and putting away used vessels and cloths. Be assured that you will be trained in all aspects of the service.

Currently we have six teams who serve two months each year, with two or three members on each team. Both men and women are encouraged to join this committee. There are additional Communion Services held during the year specifically at Christmas, during the Lenten season, and Easter. Those responsibilities are shared among the various teams.

Meetings are usually held twice a year- in spring to prepare for the Lenten and Easter seasons and again in the fall as the Advent and Christmas seasons approach.
