Each 4th Monday, a group of NW District pastors and mission leaders gather at a pub in Portland called Oregon Public House (oregonpublichouse.com). OPH's slogan is catchy – "Have a Pint – Change the World". Once they cover their basic operating expenses, ALL profits from the sale of food and craft beer at OPH are donated to local non-profit organizations – thousands of dollars each month. It's a beautiful model that embodies a healthy, balanced discipleship culture with a Christ-centered heart – i.e., following Jesus for the sake of others.

"The Oregon Public House is a place where people in the community can learn more of these outstanding non-profit organizations and discover practical ways they can become involved in transforming our world and improving the lives of others. We see our Pub as a community center for change and action where others can come to not only enjoy great food and drink, and give a little to the charity of their choice, but also learn how to take action and start to "be the change they wish to see in the world".

It's creative. It's original. It's bold. This nontraditional way of doing outreach is arresting the attention of the entire surrounding community and beyond. Here at Trinity we'll soon be challenged with the opportunity to re-purpose our CC as a Community Outreach Center. While not likely to involve craft beer, our prayer is that God's Spirit will guide us to discover something equally creative, original and bold to impact our surrounding community.






