Thoughts from Pastor Gene

Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift! (II Corinthians 9:15)

Believers in the city of Jerusalem were enduring hard times. Poverty and famine were taking a toll. Believers in Corinth and other cities were moved with compassion and responded generously.

The Jewish believers, who had reservations and concerns about Gentiles becoming Christians, were humbled by the benevolent action of the Corinthians and other predominately Gentile congregations. Doubt and even animosity were transformed into feelings of gratitude and praise to God. The Jewish believers recognized that God was at work in the Corinthian church and embraced the Gentile believers as brothers and sisters in Christ.

This service that you perform is not only supplying the needs of God's people but is also overflowing in many expressions of thanks to God. Because of the service by which you have proved yourselves, men will praise God for the obedience that accompanies your confession of the gospel of Christ, and for your generosity in sharing with them and with everyone else. And in their prayers for you their hearts will go out to you, because of the surpassing grace God has *given you.* (II Corinthians 9:12-14)

Paul understood deeply and personally what God had done in giving His Son to sacrificially atone for the sins of the world. He knew that it was God's "*indescribable gift*" to humanity. Remarkably, Paul compared the believer's act of giving with the unsurpassable love and grace of the Father who "gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16). Gratitude and generosity go hand in hand. Those who have benefited from God's "indescribable gift" should not hesitate to bless others and to support God's work as a "cheerful giver" (II Corinthians 9:7). In doing so, the love of God and the life of Christ will be increasingly evident in our lives. And God will be praised!
