A New Year . . . New Resolutions?

Forty-five percent of us start the new year with resolutions. What percentage of us actually does a good job with *keeping* those resolutions though? Are you a resolution maker? If so, here are some ways to make this the year you succeed at keeping yours:

Start early

Thinking ahead really boosts your chances of success. It's essential to make plans, not just have good intentions. (*I'm going to read the Bible from cover to cover this year*).

Keep it real

Don't overdue your resolutions! Do what is manageable and what you know you can realistically accomplish. (I'm going to read a book of the Bible a month, rather than trying to read a book of the Bible every evening).

Make a plan

Don't set yourself up with vague resolutions – set exact goals with realistic deadlines. (*I'm* going to follow a reading guide already established for reading the Bible in a year).

Make it a team effort

Find a family member, a friend, a co-worker, a neighbor...make your resolution a team effort! (*I'm going to have someone following the same plan, so I'll be accountable to someone else but also have someone to share my thoughts on what I'm reading*).

Be flexible

If you're first attempts at a resolution are a struggle, try a different way of doing things. (I'm struggling to make the time to do my Bible reading, but since I'm in the car so much, I'm going to listen to the Bible on CD).

Pay attention

Keep track of what you're doing – keep a journal, jot notes on a calendar...whatever works for you! Seeing the progress you make helps keep you going. (I'm going to write the Bible sections I read down on my calendar every day).
