It was reported during the business meeting in April that the church's General Account lost 4,270.18 and the Mission Account lost 1,228.06 in the first quarter of 2015. The financial report for the monthApril indicates the first gain of the year in the General Account but another loss in the Mission Account. # Quarterly Business Meeting Notes

On Sunday, April 19, we held our second quarterly business meeting of 2015. Pastor Gene opened the meeting with a prayer, and was followed by Church Clerk Sherry Moore who read the minutes from our January 18 business meeting. Finance Committee Chair Kelly Dodd then reviewed our 1st quarter financial report. The only account that was over budget was Church Auto, due to repairs the van. All other accounts were within budget for the quarter. We continue to see losses in both our Missions account (-\$1,228.06) and (-\$4,270.18).General account continued losses and our finances are being closely monitored bν the Finance Committee. Fortunately, we saw a slight gain in our Vanguard account (\$584.48). Our biggest expense in the 1st guarter was the replacement of one of the older AC units, which was covered by funds from our Building Fund designated account, as well as from funds that had been designated for the units replacement.

Pastor Gene briefly discussed concerns about the continued decline in giving, which is impacting both our Missions and General accounts. He also updated us on the adult Sunday School classes; several of the adult teachers needed to step back from teaching for personal reasons, which resulted in combining the Cornerstone and Community classes. When one of the teachers was able to work back into the teaching schedule, it allowed us to add a new class called Convergence, for our young adults in their 20s and 30s. Pastor Gene will be leading this class, which begins on April 26.

Pastor Gene also mentioned that we still have service opportunities on both the cleaning teams, and the "back 40" team. The cleaning team, obviously, helps keep the church clean by cleaning the restrooms, kitchen, vacuuming, and whatever else needs to be done. The "back 40" is of special concern; Bill Morris and Matt Cross have been faithful in their efforts to keep it under control. They've had help on occasion, but they need more consistent help in keeping the area cleared. There was

discussion on whether we should let the area go back to its natural state, but that raised concerns that dumping at the very back would pick up again. Possible uses of the area if we can keep it cleared were offered, including the possibility of disc golf.

The last subject Pastor Gene addressed was on the issue of outreach. This is still a concern for Bethel, and an area where we all need to be more outwardly focused, following what God wants and expects us to do and be.

Pastor Gene thanked everyone for staying after church for the meeting, and closed with a prayer.
