Announcing: Spiritual Emphasis Month II at Prince of Peace Lutheran

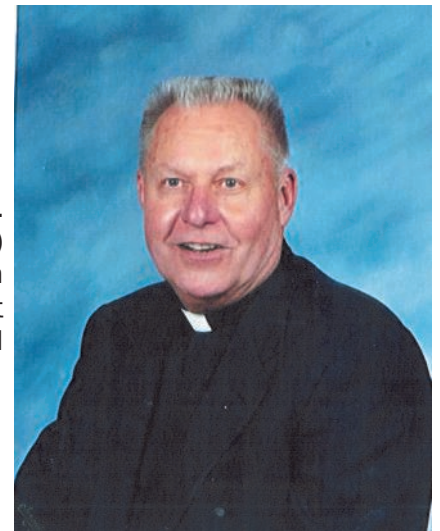

Run the Race for the Prize!

“Do you not know that in a race the runners all compete, but only one receives the prize? Run in such a way that you may win it . . .” - I Corinthians 9:24

We don't often think of buildings and grounds as part of the spiritual journey that St. Paul calls a runner's race (I Corinthians 9:24-27). But they really are. Runners need buildings if they train on treadmills, and they need a running course outside to run their races. The buildings and grounds become crucial components of a complete training program, and pacesetters know their importance!

It's no different in training people to run the race of faith, as St. Paul reminds us. What's needed are pacesetting Christians in the service of God to be “growing in faith and reaching out in love.” So, it's important that we're able to recruit, train and develop pacesetters in faith. Our capital improvement projects aim to reach this goal.

There have been many ways to learn about these capital improvements in brochures, information meetings and on Prince of Peace's website. As you study all of this information, we ask that you keep a prayerful heart open to ways that you might contribute to continue making Prince of Peace Lutheran Church a training center for Christians.

You'll see suggested improvements that

- increase fellowship opportunities in the narthex by increasing its size and seating;
- provide for a new west parking lot and restoration of the east parking lot which will allow for a better traffic flow within them and safer exits and entrances to the streets;
- improve lighting in the sanctuary and new floor coverings in the Fellowship Hall for a cleaner and more welcoming atmosphere;
- allow us to retire our mortgage in 2013!

As pacesetting Christians are trained at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church, our congregation becomes a pacesetter too! New people are attracted and join in the race of faith in our Lord Jesus Christ, and that's what congregations are supposed to do.

So, what can you do? How can you become a part of this team of pacesetters? Please be informed and become familiar with the proposed capital improvements. Pray much and consider thoughtfully how God is calling you to participate. Be attentive to the capital improvement outreach in October and early November which will challenge our levels of financial giving. Let's get our training facility up-to-par and ready for even more pacesetters!

It is 6:30 p.m. on the second Wednesday night in September and I'm in front of fifteen seventh graders in a classroom in the fellowship hall at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church. All fifteen of the kids are looking at me with expectation.

SURPRISE! I'm teaching Seventh Grade Confirmation. Here's why.

The seminary program in which I'm enrolled insures that I receive "hands-on learning" as well as book learning. So, for four semesters I will be serving in ministries at Prince of Peace that are new to me.

Seventh grade confirmation is quite different from attending Long Range Planning or Adult Education meetings. It's different from punching the keys on my computer to write columns for you to read. Seventh grade confirmation is so—well let's see—seventh grade confirmation is so REAL. The kids make noise. They are full of energy and possibility. Good News from Feed My Starving Children

We have heard from the FMSC headquarters regarding the destination of our 218,376 meals that were packed at our MobilePack event in July:

- 155,520 meals were shipped to Liberia through International Children's Fund (ICF). This is a non-profit Christian organization (based out of Neenah, WI) that provides humanitarian aid to desperately poor children and their families throughout the world, particularly in Africa.
- 62,208 meals were shipped to Niger through FMSC's partner Reach Now International. This non-profit Christian organization seeks to reach the devastated and desperate with the gospel and practical help, targeting orphans, refugees, internally displaced people, those affected by war, governmental situations, poverty, persecution, and other natural conditions and calamities.
- 648 meals were shipped to Haiti through FMSC's partner Free the Kids. With the help of Klinik Espwa (a medical clinic), Free the Kids (a Christian non-profit organization) offers residence to over 600 orphaned and abandoned children in Espwa.

Again...many thanks for your prayers and gifts of time and money to help make all of this happen!

99 Thoughts for Parents of Teenagers...



Identity—that's what they're seeking to discover. The stereotype of teenagers back in the hippie days of the 1960s depicted them talking about trying to "find themselves." While today's teenagers rarely hitchhike to California as part of that quest, the single most important developmental issue in a teenager's life is still identity formation. In the end, every teenager chooses to find his or her identity in something. The place they land now in terms of understanding themselves will profoundly influence what they believe and who they are. That's why one of the most important parenting issues we face is the identity formation of our teenagers. In a perfect world, our children would answer the question "Who am I?" by finding their identity in who they are as unique individuals created by God in the image of God for a relationship with him. But our fallen world gives our children countless other options. Consequently, they embrace idolatry when they find their identity, value, and worth in something or someone other than God. In today's world, our teenagers are prone to walk the dangerous path of seeking identity in sexual partners, romantic interests, academic accomplishments, athletic achievements, money, possessions, pleasurable experiences, peer approval, or even the pursuit of noble social causes. To help your teenagers navigate through these options and into the place where they find their identity in Jesus Christ alone, openly recognize and discuss these options with your children. And remember this: Where you have found your identity speaks louder than any words you could ever muster.

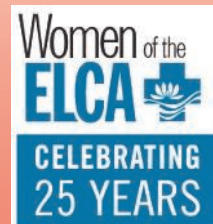
