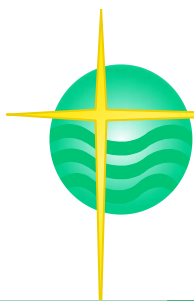

This summer at Redeemer we will be going to the movies! ... or actually, we will be bringing the movies to us. During the months of June and July we will be exploring some Biblical themes through the lens of popular movies.

Some of the movies you may have seen and some you may not. If you would like to view the movies ahead of time, that is fine, but not essential. The reason for this is that we are not studying the movie, we are studying the Bible. We will use the movie and some of its themes and situations to set the stage for our Biblical study. It should be fun!

To make the series more fun and inviting, we are also going to have some special touches ... like popcorn during Sunday refreshments, and a free movie ticket for first-time local families who fill out a Connection Card. Summer is a time when people are looking for new routines. Why not



invite your friends to come and check out Redeemer and use "God on Film" as a good opportunity to do so? We have made invite cards available for just that purpose. Keep a couple with you and hand them out!

There are a few

things we want to keep in mind throughout this series though. "God on Film" is not a critique of the movie; we won't be talking about what's good and bad in the movie. It also isn't intended to be a synopsis of the movie; we won't be explaining what the movie is all about. Nor is it an endorsement of these movies; ultimately you must determine if watching the full movie is right for you or your family. Our selection of movies has more to do with choosing some memorable scenarios to serve as a springboard for the Biblical message. You'll hear the same Christ-centered, Gospel-oriented messages that we regularly share at Redeemer.

Our reasons for doing this sort of series are many. People watch movies, and people go to church. Often we fail, however, to see how the two connect. Our hope is that by talking about movies in a Biblical context we will equip you as a follower of Christ to engage our world in thoughtful, creative and yet Biblical ways. Why? Because faith relates to all of life. We don't want to "compartmentalize" our faith into just Sunday morning. If we are going to experience true Gospel-oriented lives, we need to apply our faith to all of life's situations – both in and outside church. Christ did not isolate Himself from the world, nor should we.

This is something critical for us to consider as we think about how we do mission in today's world. At the recent "Great Commission Summit" we were challenged to recognize that **God desires to be glorified by making himself known...** and that as the Church, **mission isn't something that we do, but something that we join God on!** We must constantly ask the question, "how are we making Christ known?" I believe to do this well, we must regularly be reaching out to a wider audience than those who are

SOLAR POWER AT REDEEMER? Rocky Collins

The Church Council has directed a committee to research the possibility of installing a solar power system on the property in order to reduce our electric utility expense. Early analysis indicates that savings could be very significant.

Background Facts: During 2011, Redeemer spent \$23,825 on electricity. During 2014, Redeemer spent \$36,790 on electricity while total kWh used decreased each year. Therefore, electric expense has increased 54% over the last 3 years and rates are expect to increase in the future.

Analysis: The Solar Committee has received 2 bids to install a full solar system and the prices range from 196,000 to 145,000 with variables such as different brands of solar panels, extended warrantees, and additional inverters. Redeemer may also qualify for a state rebate if funds are still available when our application is processed. The state rebate would be paid back to Redeemer over a 5-year period and that would bring the total cost down to approximately \$161,000 to \$110,000. As a non-profit organization, Redeemer would not qualify for federal tax credits or

rebates. The savings in our utility bills would pay for the system within 3-6 years. After the initial investment is paid off, the 20-year savings would be estimated to be \$1,230,000 if utility rates increase 6% per year. The 30-year savings are estimated to be \$2,706,000.

Preliminary Design: The solar system would be divided into three arrays. The largest array would be 78 solar panels on the highest south facing roof of the sanctuary. The other two arrays would consist of 39 and 75 solar panels on each of the two school buildings. The solar array on the sanctuary would not be visible from the ground because of the height and pitch of the roofline. The solar arrays on the school buildings would be visible from the parking lot. This design should nearly cover our electricity requirements throughout the year.

Some people talk the walk; others walk the walk. Janet (Kunkel) Borchard epitomizes the latter. Since 1982 she has been a missionary with Lutheran Bible Translators. Her first assignment included language projects in New Mexico and Namibia. Since 1998, when she married the Rev. Terry Borchard, Janet has worked with the Ipli people of Papua New Guinea, an island roughly the size of California just north of Australia.

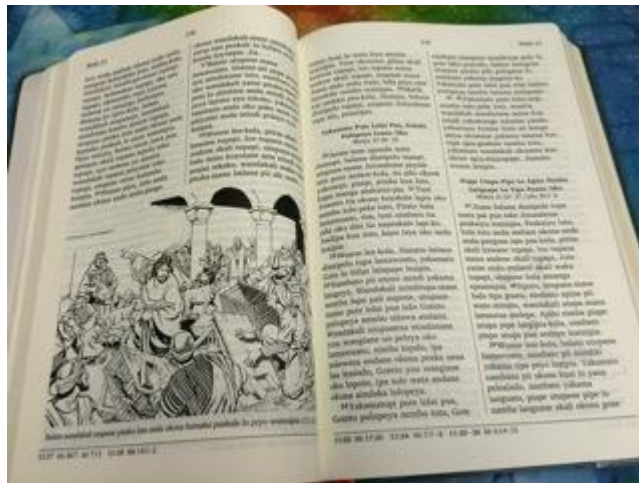
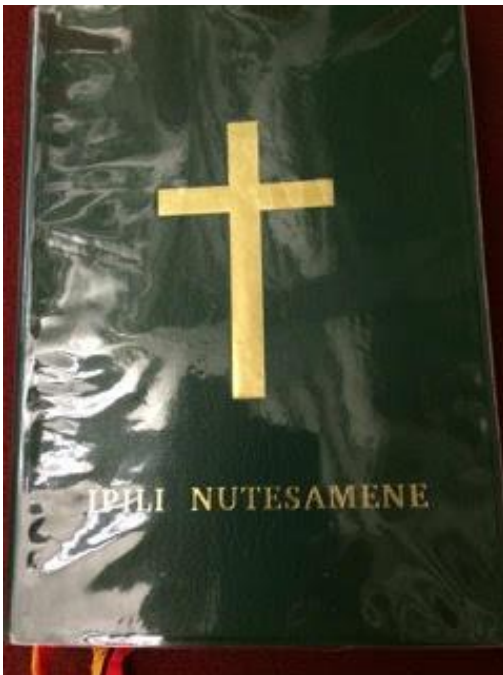
LWML had the distinct honor to hear Janet speak to us at our May meeting. Her multi-media presentation, including a quick lesson in translating from English to Ipli (!), showed us how massive is the task of making the word of God accessible in a language and media that people most readily comprehend.



In 2008, after literally decades of labor, the Iplis held a spiritual festival dedicating the New Testament Bible, a beautifully written masterpiece in their own language. As Janet played clips of the colorful ceremony, we witnessed a people proud of their accomplishment and secure in their Christian belief.

In 2016, Janet will return to Papua New Guinea and make the days' long trip to the Iplis from her missionary center home once again. However, it will be a journey without a partner, as Terry died in August 2014 after a 7 year battle with multiple myeloma cancer. Pastor Mandita Kunuma and Janet will oversee a recording of Ipli Genesis and an HIV/AIDS video, as well as revising other Old Testament books.

Those projects will complement an audio recording of the New Testament in 2009, the Jesus video in 2012, and the translation of Genesis completed in 2014.



As part of its missionary mandate, LWML annually contributes to Lutheran Bible Translators, %Janet Borchard. Nearly 2000 of the almost 7000 languages spoken in the world today have no translated Scripture. We salute Janet for helping to ensure that one more people have a Bible in their native language.

SALT & LIGHT Dan Bitner

Thanks to all who stopped by our information table on May 31st. Our goal was simply to provide you information about our program.

Scripture tells us to be involved in civic affairs and that is the idea we are promoting. LCMS

is also on board with the sentiments expressed in Salt & Light and is creating a presence in the Washington D.C. to directly communicate with gov't leaders.



At the event, we handed out 70 information flyers along with some historical information about this Christian Nation we call America. The Biblical underpinnings of America were so obvious to previous generations that in 1892, the U.S. Supreme Court had no difficulty in rendering a unanimous decision declaring: "No purpose of action against religion can be imputed to any legislation, state or national, because this is a religious people ... This is a Christian nation." There is a long and rich history of Christianity in the governance of American and too much has been hidden over the years; we need to reclaim it. As George Washington said in his farewell address - "Of all the dispositions and habits which lead to political prosperity, religion and morality are indispensable supports."

Going forward, our group plans to continue the study of how we live out the Great Commission in civil government and how can we be worthy stewards of that high calling. All are welcome to join in our meetings. They include some education, usually video based, and then casual, low key type discussion. You can come once and see if it fits and then become a regular if it does.

For the Congregation, we will be bringing issues that provide an opportunity, through writing postcards or making phone calls, for all to participate in our civil governance. We will also provide encouragement for voter registration and will help in providing objective information on the issues and where candidates stand on them.

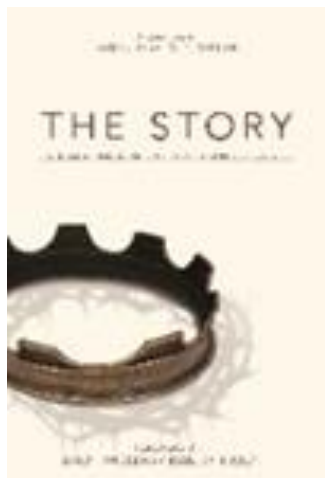
