

Chaplains in the News

At 9:00am on 5/9/23 ICPC Illinois State Area Representative Chaplain Ric Worshill was invited to present the ICPC 2023 Illinois State, Wentink-

Kauffman Award of Excellence in Law Enforcement Chaplaincy to Chaplain Troy Shoaf. This event was held at the Bolingbrook Police Department in Illinois. Chief of Police, Mike Rompa scheduled the presentation as the finale for the Coffee With The Chief's monthly event. There were about 15 police officers and command staff, The Fire Chief with some firefighters, about 30 citizens and some of the village leadership, including Mayor Mary Alexander-Basta.





The following Bolingbrook chaplains were also in attendance; Chaplain Sharon Engert (ICPC), Chaplain Raymond Hamilton (ICPC), Chaplain Elmer Harris III (ICPC), Chaplain Bernard Kendrick (ICPC) and Chaplain Tony Signh. Chaplain Worshill gave the honor of making the presentation to Chief Mike Rompa.

This was an example of a law enforcement agency that is proud of and loves their chaplains, who volunteer their time to serve the officers, support staff and the citizens. The award was duly presented to a chaplain who truly deserved recognition. Chaplain Shoaf serves the Bolingbrook Police Department, the United States Secret Service and has assisted members of the International Conference of Police Chaplains.

Message from National Association of Police Organizations

Dear NAPO Members,

This afternoon, the Biden Administration let us know that they will be releasing the final National Accreditation Standards tomorrow, May 25. These Standards will be used to determine if a law enforcement agency accreditation entity qualifies as an "authorized, independent credentialing body" pursuant to Section 19 of the President's Executive Order on police and criminal justice reform. These are the standards independent credentialing bodies must consider when accrediting law enforcement agencies. A law enforcement agency accredited under different criteria will not be considered accredited by the Department of Justice (DOJ). Agencies and departments that are accredited to these standards will receive prioritization for state and local law enforcement grant programs.

The COPS Office shared initial draft accreditation standards with NAPO back in January and we were asked to submit formal comments, feedback, and recommendations on the standards. The Executive Order (EO) is fairly prescriptive with what the accreditation standards must include so there is little wiggle room for what should or should not be considered by accrediting agencies. The EO states that the national credentialing standards must further the policies laid out in Sections 3 (Hiring, Recruitment, and Retention), 4 (Supporting Office Wellness), 7 (Banning Chokeholds and Carotid Restraints), 8 (Use of Force Standards), 9 (Anti-Bias Training and Guidance), and 10 (Restricting No-Knock Entries). Where we tried to make a difference was in how the specific standards are written, implemented, and evaluated.

In the extensive official comments on the draft standards that NAPO submitted, we underscored the issues where the guidelines deviated from current legal doctrine and standards and infringed upon officer rights, including possibly their collective bargaining rights, and areas where the guidelines may be difficult to implement. We also reiterated many of our concerns with the Executive Order that were reflected in the required draft standards, particularly around use of force standards, officer due process, restricting no-knock entries, and the banning of chokeholds and carotid restraints.

The Administration indicated that while it is releasing the final National Accreditation Standards tomorrow, it is still working on how best to implement them with the understanding that they will be expensive and may take time for departments to comply with, particularly small departments with less resources. They promised to work with agencies and stakeholders throughout this process. NAPO continues to engage with the Administration on the implementation of the EO and we will work with the DOJ on how to best enact these Standards. We will keep you apprised of these discussions and the continued execution of the various aspects of the EO.

Chaplain Memoriam



Ronald Mackay Neish Oak Glen, California April 27, 1931- March 9, 2023

Ronald Mackay Neish died March 9, 2023 at home in Oak Glen.

Ronald was born April 27, 1931, in Banff, Alberta, Canada. Elder Neish served as a literature evangelist in Canada and the United States. He was a missionary to the Southern Asia Division of Seventh-day Adventists for 10 years, where he led out in disaster/ famine relief, directed sabbath schools, and promoted evangelism. Elder Neish served in India and as the first president of the Bangladesh Union of Seventh-day Adventists following the country's civil war. He was dearly loved and respected by those he served.

He was the Vice Principal for Finance at La Sierra Academy and served as a local elder and treasurer for the Yucaipa Seventh-day Adventist Church. Elder Neish was a chaplain with the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department for 23 years.

He was called to the World Trade Center following the 9/11 attack where he worked at ground zero for three weeks helping other first responders rescuing and recovering those who died at the scene.

A Word About the Credential Process

RICHARD KASSEL, CREDENTIAL CHAIR

Members routinely ask about obtaining a Basic Credential Certificate after taking the 12 Basic Core Courses at an Annual, Region, or District Training Seminar.

Completion of the courses meet *part* of the requirements for a Basic Credential, it is *not* an automatic process.

Credential Application Requirements

- 1. Member of ICPC
- 2. CEU and ICPC CEU hours/criteria:
 - **Basic**—3.5 CEU (ICPC-1.5 Basic Core Courses)
 - Liaison—4.0 CEU (ICPC-1.5 Basic Core Courses and .45 Liaison I, II and III)
 - Senior—15 CEU (ICPC-1.5); hold a Basic/ Liaison Credential; 5 years as a law enforcement chaplain
 - Master—35 CEU (ICPC-3.5); hold a Senior Credential; 10 years as a law enforcement chaplain
 - Diplomate—50 CEU (ICPC-5); hold a Master Credential; 15 years as a law enforcement chaplain; and 20 ATS/RTS Credits
 - **Fellow**—100 CEU (ICPC 10); hold a Diplomate Credential; 20 years as a law enforcement chaplain; 40 ATS/RTS Credits

The ICPC Credentialing Pamphlet (available on the front side of our website under the Credential Tab or <u>HERE</u>) provides definitions and additional details.

After review of the Credentialing Pamphlet, verify with the Academic Team to see if you meet all the requirements.

Once verified, you must apply for a credential by completing the appropriate application form from the ICPC website (icpc4cops.org)—Members Only Section—Credential Folder.

Members of the ICPC Credential Committee are eager to assist our members in obtaining higher levels of credentials.

There are committee members in each region of ICPC who conduct the interviews required for Senior and Master Credential Levels.

You will find them helpful as you seek any of the offered credential levels. Their names are listed on the website (Members Only Section—Committee Folder—Committee Roster). Please do not hesitate to contact them if you need assistance in preparing your application.

Credential Certificates—Final Approval

Basic, Liaison, Senior, and Master Level— Certificates and pins are mailed from the ICPC Corporate office.

Diplomate and Fellow—Certificates and pins are presented at the ATS.

Transcripts

Dr. John Transue, Academic Registrar, strives to maintain accurate records; however, it behooves each member to maintain a record of ICPC courses and/or other academic submissions.





All the things he happened on that he cannot un-see.


Now there's prayers he prays at night, and fears that he confessed



History of ICPC LOGO

The ICPC logo is shaped like a five-pointed star of the early peace officer which was made famous by the Texas Rangers. Superimposed upon this is the more modern shield, the badge of office for those who have sworn to "shield" the public from those who would violate the law.

A field of blue, for truth, is surrounded by a circle of gold, for the unity of our chaplain family. Superimposed on the shield are the symbols of the Judean-Christian faith, signifying faiths of ICPC's Founders, the six-pointed Star of David and the Cross of Christ.

A laurel wreath, a symbol of honor, surrounds the shield distinguishing the law enforcement profession. At the top of the shield is a rising sun signifying God's Word.

Thus, we have both symbols of law enforcement and faith inextricably woven together and superimposed to symbolize our office as law enforcement chaplains.
