The Role as Pastor:

First Calvary Baptist Church is seeking a Pastor that will lead the congregation in all aspects of ministry including: worship, teaching, preaching, administration of staff, and stewardship. We seek an individual who extends God's grace to others and leads by example as one who is relational, authentic, transparent, and humble. A successful candidate must have a demonstrated ability to relate to and connect with a multi-generational and historically black congregation. Additionally, the candidate should have a heart for proclaiming the Gospel and a desire to extend ministry to the community surrounding the church with vision to extend beyond to the triangle community, the state and national levels. We seek a Pastor who actively participates in spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ and can be the spiritual leader and administrator responsible for supervising the various ministries of the church in accordance with the provisions of the church constitution and bylaws and counsel with the Diaconate and Trustees.



First Calvary Baptist Church (FCBC) of Durham, North Carolina

First Calvary Baptist Church was organized in 1884. It was originally called Second Baptist Church and was located on Cameron Street which is now Cornell Street. A wood frame building was erected in 1926 and was responsible for acquiring the current present site of the church on Morehead and Kent Street. The church grew under progressive leadership and in 1949 the church's name was changed from Second Baptist Church to First Calvary Baptist Church. On Sunday, July 10, 1949, worship service was held for the first time in the new brick building.

Over the 136 years, First Calvary, proudly called FCBC, has called 6 Pastors prior to 1991:

Pastor WD Smith	1926-1928
Pastor HH Hart	1935-1937 & 1947-1953
Pastor CE McLester	1937-1947
Pastor AL Thompson	1954-1979
Pastor VS Thompson	1980-1986
Pastor Paul Jackson	1987-1990

In June 1991, the church body chose its 7th Pastor, Fredrick A. Davis. He has faithfully served this Body for 29 years. With the guiding hand of God, the membership has not only increased, but the giving of tithes and offerings increased by more than 95%. Pastor Davis re-instituted Prayer Service, weekly Bible Study, and implemented an early morning Sunday worship service. In an effort to serve and be served, FCBC has over fifty active ministries for people of all ages.

First Calvary is very active in the Community. The Church has a weekly Food Pantry, serving approximately 900 individuals each year. Additionally, the Church has the Bessie Smith House, which houses the quarterly Clothing Giveaway. The Church gives financially to various organizations and educational institutions, including Urban Ministries and the Baptist House of Duke University. First Calvary Baptist Church also envisioned a nonprofit organization to provide programs and services to the West End and Durham area residents that foster economic development and community revitalization through education, health care, job training, civic and cultural awareness and housing initiatives. In 1993, Calvary Ministries of the West End Community Incorporated, a 501(c)3 non-profit corporation was established, now called the West End Community Foundation, Inc. (WECF, Inc.). In October 2002, the Community Family Life and Recreation Center at Lyon Park was opened. First Calvary Baptist Church continues to spiritually, physically, and financially support this nonprofit organization.

The church underwent a massive expansion project in October 2008 to re-build a larger church edifice to include a sanctuary accommodating one-thousand worshippers with additional educational space. Construction was completed in January 2010.
