The Bible is not shy to describe the experiences of people who endured great hardships. Joseph was a man who was hated by his brothers, sold into slavery and imprisoned on false charges. David was a man pursued by the king and all of his military power and later faced a rebellion by his own son causing him to flee for his life from his own home. It hardly seems necessary to point out the abuse Jesus endured. Betrayed by one of his closest friends, hated by the people he came to save, and then the only sinless man in the world was executed, not for his crimes, but for yours. Facing life's trials is not unusual or uncommon; in fact it would be odd for you to not face trials of one kind or another on a regular basis.

One who suffered a unique trial was a man named Jonah. His rebellion against God caused him to endure a relentless storm at sea which ended up with Jonah as fish food for a giant fish. I've been through some struggles, but I've never faced anything like that. While being bounced

around in the middle of the sea on his divine submarine ride, he to his suffering to God.

You threw me into the ocean depths, and I sank down to the heart of the sea. The mighty waters engulfed me; I was buried beneath your wild and stormy waves. Jonah 2:3 (NIV)

"I sank beneath the waves, and the waters closed over me. Seaweed wrapped itself around my head. I sank down to the very roots of the mountains. I was imprisoned in the earth, whose gates lock shut forever. Jonah 2:5-6 (NIV)

Jonah confessed the pain and suffering he was enduring, but he also recognized something very important, God had not abandoned him. Many people go through hard times they say things like, "Why is God allowing this to happen?" On the other hand, some refuse to recognize the problems altogether. Jonah not only brought his problems to the Lord,

he also clung to God's promises.

From inside the fish Jonah prayed to the Lord his God. He said:

"In my distress I called to the Lord, and he answered me. From deep in the realm of the dead I called for help, and you listened to my cry." Jonah 2:1-2 (NIV)

I said, 'I have been banished from your sight; yet I will look again toward your holy temple.' ...

But you, Lord my God, brought my life up from the pit. Jonah 2:4-6 (NIV)

He knew that he was near death. But he also knew, that God had not abandoned him completely. He knew that God was still in control and no matter what he faced as he sat in the belly of the fish. If God can rescue a man from the belly of a fish, he can certainly rescue you. God is always in control no matter what struggle you are facing.
