Every month I sit down in front of the computer and think to myself, "What am I going to write about this month? What awe-inspiring and captivating words of wisdom can I impart to the members of the Suburban Christian Church in this month's newsletter?" Often the same thoughts run through my head, grace, forgiveness, the sacrifice of Christ, God's love for you, repentance, and a thousand other topics I've talked about many times. Today, it's everybody's favorite subject, fasting.

In Matthew 6, Jesus mentions three spiritual disciplines he expects believers to practice. First on the list is giving. Every Christian understands the importance of financial giving. Next he addresses praying. Again, every Christian understands the importance of praying. Then he comes to fasting, "When you fast," he says. It's never a question of "if," it's always a question of "when." Most people would say a Christian who doesn't give is not a very good Christian. In the same way, most would say a Christian who doesn't pray is not a very good Christian. So what does that say about a Christian who doesn't fast? It was a common part of worship and religious practice in the New Testament, but it seems to a forgotten practice with American Christians.

Why doesn't the church fast like it should? Are we to accustom to the abundance of our country? Have all of our fast food restaurants and all-you-can-eat buffets pushed the concept of fasting far away from us?

There are numerous physical and spiritual advantages to fasting on a regular basis. Fasting helps to sever the ties with the physical world and refocus your attention on the spiritual. Fasting from elements necessary for physical survival strengthens your dependence on God for your spiritual growth and substance. On the physical side there are numerous biological advantages to the practice of fasting. Besides the obvious weight loss or weight maintenance, fasting gives your digestive system a rest, helps to remove toxins from the body, and has shown to have numerous other health benefits.

Jesus never questioned that his followers would fast. It was an expectation of all Christians.

Then John's disciples came and asked him, "How is it that we and the Pharisees fast often, but your disciples do not fast?"

Jesus answered, "How can the guests of the bridegroom mourn while he is with them? The time will come when the bridegroom will be taken from them; then they will fast. Matthew 9:14-15 (NIV)
