2015 S. Ohio Data – During 2015 the S. Ohio District shared God's love through rebuilding homes and providing CWS kits. There were fifteen trips with 191 volunteers serving in New Jersey and Colorado. The total trip cost was \$14,988.17. For Church World Service, 37 Baby Kits, 500 Hygiene Kits, 200 Clean Up Buckets, and 1,648 School Kits were assembled at a cost of \$9,841.71. Through Brethren Helping Hands, twenty volunteers painted at Brethren House for Bethany Seminary. 2016 Annual Conference Update 2016 Annual Conference will be held in Greensboro, North Carolina. Early delegate registration remains the same at \$285. In terms of housing costs, in Greensboro, we will only have one hotel (the convention center and the hotel are all in one building). Our hotel rate is \$109 + 12.75% tax which makes it a total of \$121.75 inclusive. The Sheraton is also giving us free parking and free wi-fi, so there is no additional charge for those. Registration for both delegates and non-delegates will open in February.

Church of the Brethren General Secretary speaks out Against Anti-Muslim Rhetoric

Church of the Brethren General Secretary, Stanley J. Noffsinger, has issued a statement against the current escalation of rhetoric that seeks to demonize Muslims. Citing Jesus' commands to love God, and love neighbor as self, and the parable of the Good Samaritan, the statement also calls church members to revisit portions of the 1991 Annual Conference statement "Peacemaking: The Call of God's Peace in History" that directs the church to "explore avenues of interfaith dialogue leading toward a visible expression of God's plan for human unity."
