Eight Kitchenaid mixers were kept busy creating all the doughs. All day long the cookies kept coming and going in the oven, out of the oven. The good thing was that not one of the trays of cookies was burned. So many cookies were made that we lost count. Well over 4000 cookies were packed in trays ready for delivery. What seemed like a mountain of cookies vanished before our eyes as people picked up orders or took cookies back to their home churches to fill the orders. We could hardly believe it - all the cookies were gone. Even requests for more cookies couldn't be filled, because the cookies were not there. We were sold out! It was hoped that the Cookie Camp would make around \$600. After expenses and with some very generous donations, the profit was \$1300. What a wonderful show of support people of the District have shown by buying the cookies we made. This money will help pay for the rental of Cricket Holler for Winter Blast, a gathering of campers and friends for a winter adventure later in January. The remainder of the money will go to fund some activities at summer camp. Many churches had volunteers come to do the baking, decorating, and packing of the cookies. Without these kind volunteers, Cookie Camp would not be possible. I know everyone who helped with the camp felt exhausted at the end of the day. Yet the tremendous feeling of being a part of a wonderful event, lifted each heart a little bit and gave all the campers the Christmas spirit through their service. Saying "Thank you" seems small for the dedication shown at Cookie Camp 2016. But a huge "THANK YOU!" is sent to everyone who helped.

### **Disaster Ministry Updates**

**2016 Data** - In 2016 the S. Ohio District was very supportive of BDM. One hundred thirty-three volunteers went on twelve trips to Colorado, West Virginia, Michigan, and S. Carolina to help rebuild homes for disaster survivors, costing just over \$9,000. For Church World Service 1,700 School Kits and 32 Baby Kits were assembled at a cost of \$9,100. Sewing Bees were held about every six weeks to sew bags for these school kits. A trip was organized to the Brethren Service Center with twenty-three volunteers. Locally twelve workdays were held at Mack Memorial COB to repair the educational wing. Thirty-six workers from eleven churches helped with this project. Also, there were volunteers who served through Children's Disaster Service. Others throughout the district collected and sorted books for Nigeria. Two donors helped make it possible to purchase a 2015 Ford Transit Van. Thank you to all for your support of S. Ohio BDM.
