Disaster Ministry Updates

Children's Disaster Services (CDS) Training – Since 1980 Children's Disaster Services (CDS) has been meeting the needs of children by setting up child care centers in shelters and disaster assistance centers. Specially trained to respond to traumatized children, volunteers provide a calm, safe and reassuring presence in the midst of the chaos created by natural or human caused disasters.

On April 20 & 21, 2018 there will be a training for those who want to become CDS volunteers and for recertification of current volunteers. It will be held at Trotwood Church of the Brethren. Hurricane Response -Following the hurricanes in Texas, Florida, and Puerto Rico, our district responded to the tremendous need by assembling 504 Cleanup Buckets for Church World Service. About \$33,000 has been received to fund this project, which cost about \$14,200. The project was estimated to cost about \$20,000, but using pickle buckets rather than purchasing buckets for \$5 or \$6 a piece, made a big difference in the project cost. BDM also partnered with the Brethren Retirement Community who assembled 1,000 Hygiene Kits. BDM paid \$2,000 which covers the \$2 per kit fee for shipping the kits from the warehouse to the point of need.

Donations exceeded the cost of the Cleanup Bucket project, enabling us to expand our response. Church World Service now needs more hygiene kits. Brethren Disaster Ministries needs funds for the response in Puerto Rico. Therefore, our next projects will be purchasing supplies for 1,000 hygiene kits, and sending a \$10,000 donation to the Emergency Disaster Fund, designated for relief in Puerto Rico. Thank you to everyone for their compassion and generosity.

2018 Trip Schedules – In 2018 ten rebuilding trips are scheduled ([Click Here](#)), with room for fifteen volunteers on each trip. Current sites are Eureka, MO and Marion, SC, with new sites opening later in the year. Volunteers need to be at least fifteen years old, unless they go with a parent or guardian, and then they may be fourteen. The June and July trips are for youth and their leaders.
