Hurricane Response –Volunteer Opportunities in FL - Through National BDM, work weeks are planned for January 7-13 and January 14-20 in Lorida, FL. Volunteers from various districts will be doing roof repair from damage caused by Hurricane Irma. Additional information can be found on the website.

Hygiene Kits – In response to Church World Service's (CWS) need for hygiene kits, S. Ohio BDM is ordering supplies for 1,000 kits. The need is great, due to a large number of hygiene kits being distributed this fall when hurricanes struck Texas, Florida, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands. A February assembly date is anticipated. This project will be funded by donations that exceeded the cost of the CWS cleanup bucket project.
