Pre Conference Event: The Body of Christ in Corinth and America

This year's District pre-conference event will be a 4 hr teaching session entitled "The Body of Christ in Corinth and America" and will be led by Guest Speaker, Dan Ulrich, Wieand Professor of New Testament Studies at Bethany Seminary. Here is a brief description of the talk. "In response to news about divisions within the house churches in Corinth, Paul's effort to repair the beloved body of Christ included writing an instructive letter. The thesis of that letter is an appeal for unity and reconciliation. As Christians who may also need reconciliation, let's gather to study 1 Corinthians with Paul's overall purpose and message in mind. We will not ignore some passages that figure in our divisive debates today, but we will interpret them contextually, showing how the message of the cross and the Spirit's gift of love can still work to heal Christ's body." CEUs will be granted upon request.

Allison is the past Executive Director of partners in Hope. After leaving her work at PIH she moved to Booulder, Colorado and Studied at the Naropa University. While she was studying at Naropa she did an independent study of the Nag Hammadi texts - early Christian texts that were discovered in Nag Hammadi, Egypt in 1945. She is now a board member of a non-profit called the Tanho Center, which is working to build awareness of these texts. Tanho Center recently as produced a short film about one of these texts, The Gospel of Mary.

Each day is structured with Bible studies, singing, sharing, interesting speakers, activities, games, puzzles, arts, crafts and a light lunch. People from many churches have been meeting new friends and getting to know other friends better as they gather together during these Bible schools. People attending have said they feel refreshed and renewed by the experience and this set apart time for personal growth and fun. Southern Ohio/Kentucky Disaster Ministries Update

Update from BDM leaders in Lumberton, NC – Our volunteer housing was not flooded by Hurricane Florence. There are some homes that we started working on before the storm that were not affected, or affected minimally, that we are continuing to work on. We believe that we will have some rebuild work, some roof work and some muck and gut work for those that can physically handle that. I have not heard any word on the homes that we completed in Lumberton. I do know of one that we almost completed that had several feet of water in it, and needs to be re-done. The city and FEMA are discussing steps forward.

All of the houses in Nichols, SC received water. We will muck and gut them as the homeowners and the town decide on how they are going to move forward.

Volunteer Now! Oct. 7-13 and Nov. 4-10 -- BDM continues to work in Lumberton, NC. There are openings for three volunteers on the Oct. 7-13 trip, and five volunteers on the Nov. 4-10 trip. We want a full crew of fifteen for each trip.

Volunteer in Puerto Rico - BDM is scheduling small groups of 5-7 volunteers to work in Castañer, Puerto Rico rebuilding homes for COB members. Volunteers need to be able to work in a hot humid climate. It is hoped that most volunteers will stay at least two weeks (10 working days). Assistance is available for airfare. - --Church Families Impacted by New Government Regulations--The federal government has been adding burdensome new rules for immigrants, refugees, and asylum seekers. Families in our church are having to take days off from work to meet the new requirements. They are also experiencing long delays in receiving and renewing their work permits and green cards for which they are eligible. One church member has been unable to obtain a driver's license due to a new requirement that his government-issued ID cards be verified as authentic, and that verification has not been timely. Please keep our church families in prayer as they face the growing costs of navigating these increasingly-heavy paperwork burdens, as well as the fear and stress involved in this process. Also, pray for immigration attorneys overwhelmed by the increasing workload of serving their clients in this environment.
- -- Congregations in pastoral transition-- Prince of Peace has called Katie and Tim Heishman as co-pastors beginning in October; Painter Creek has made arrangements for regular pulpit supply; Good Shepherd is seeking pastoral services; Beech Grove pastor Dewayne Heck has announced plans for retirement.
- -- May we remember the possibility of new church starts in various locations in our district.
- --There are many issues and situations continuing to face us as we minister in our respective locations, including those who are serving in interim situations and others who are in discernment regarding placement or are considering a move. There are others facing health issues, please keep these situations in prayer. Please contact Dave if you know of prayer situations of which he should be aware. May we lift each other in prayer as we work to continue the work of Jesus, peacefully, simply, together.
