2019 Summer Camp registration is open!

Registrations are open for the **2019 Peace Works Summer Camp** season in Southern Ohio/Kentucky District COB. Finding peace, working for peace and becoming God's peacemakers are themes all the camps will explore. There is a camp for every person in the church, and everyone is encouraged to be a part of the exciting and fulfilling time of faith sharing.

Two new camps are being offered: Junior Discovery Camp June 9 - 11, and Beginner Sewing/Quilting Camp June 10 - 14.

Junior Discovery is designed as a transitional camp for children who have completed 2nd grade to 4th grade. It will give the campers a taste of what camp life is, but not be away from home for a long period of time. This camp will end in the evening of the last day with a campfire for the campers and their families.

Beginner Sewing/Quilting Camp will explore different kinds of sewing, how to use a sewing machine, quilting techniques for beginners. Campers will have all the supplies, fabric, sewing machines provided so they can determine if this is something they want to pursue in the future before investing large sums on their own sewing machine or supplies. Several expert teachers will be ready to instruct and assist campers in their selections of projects. This is a day camp with lunch and snacks provided. Campers will return home to rest in their own beds before returning to camp each day.

Intergenerational Service Camp is a great opportunity for high school students to earn their community service credits as the camp visits sites to volunteer their labor. Working with other adult campers has been a great way to build new relationships and understanding across the generations. After a day at work, evenings are spent in group building, games, swimming, fun, and time for reflection. All the other traditional camps are still being offered.
