Steve Schweitzer writes, "Science Fiction is extremely popular in our wider culture. It engages theological themes and raises questions that our culture is asking. Based on a course I teach at Bethany, this workshop will explore key themes in popular SciFi series: The Matrix Trilogy, Star Trek, and the Marvel superhero movie Black Panther. Each one asks deep questions about the nature of existence, what it means to be human, the nature of violence and peace, and our responsibility to our communities and to the wider world."

Steve Schweitzer (PhD, Notre Dame) is Academic Dean and Professor at Bethany Theological Seminary. He regularly teaches a graduate seminar on Chronicles-Ezra-Nehemiah and a course on Science Fiction and Theology. Steve has preached, taught, and led workshops for several congregations and districts, including Bible studies and Insight Sessions at Annual Conference. Steve and his wife, Jill, have 3 children. They attend Cedar Grove Church of the Brethren in the Southern Ohio/Kentucky district.

Southern Ohio Disaster Ministries Update

2019 Data - The S. Ohio/KY District has had a very active year with Disaster Ministries. There were 17 rebuilding trips with 139 volunteers. These trips were to North Carolina, Puerto Rico, and St. Thomas at a cost of \$24,000. Locally, through Brethren Helping Hands, there was one ramp project with New Carlisle COB. With the Memorial Day tornadoes, 665 volunteers worked 70+ days at a cost of \$7,000. For Church World

Service (CWS), 528 Cleanup Buckets, 2,500 School Kits and 2,200 Hygiene Kits were assembled for \$39,000. At seven Sewing Bees, 61 participants sewed bags for school kits or prepped items for buckets/kits. There was also a trip to the Brethren Service Center with 35 volunteers who processed CWS kits. Through Children's Disaster Services, three volunteers served in Texas and N. Carolina. Thank you to all for your support. Together we bring hope and share God's love.

2020 Rebuilding Trips – Sign up for a trip in 2020! The current site is in Lumberton, NC, and a site in Tampa, FL opens mid-January. Volunteers need to be at least fifteen years old, unless they go with a parent or guardian, and then they may be fourteen. Expenses are covered, and transportation is provided.
