## **Move in Our Midst**

An Invitation to Participate

I grew up in the Cedar Grove church. For a small rural church, we were fortunate to have three women who weekly led the congregational singing. Alice Moore-organist; Miriam Moore- pianist; and my mother-Treva Timmons- chorister. I never learned to read music but I was blessed with a good “ear,” which means I learned by rote to sing harmonies along with a congregation that robustly and unashamedly sang its faith in worship. One hymn that was a part of my formation was “Move In Our Midst,” with words by Kenneth Morse and music by Perry Huffaker. I remember driving to West Milton as a teenager, and Perry Huffaker directing a district chorus that filled the sanctuary on a Sunday afternoon with music, capped with the singing of “Move In Our Midst.” It is the hymn that has become an “anthem” for the Church of the Brethren. “Move in our Midst” is the theme of our 2021 District Conference.

It was first said by Peter to the early followers of Jesus on the Day of Pentecost. “In the days to come, I will pour out my Spirit on all humankind. Your daughters and sons will prophecy, your young people will see visions and your elders will dream dreams.” (The Inclusive New Testament)

While the images and narratives of the 24 hour news cycle the last fourteen months have been painful, in the days to come, I believe we are being/have been prepared with God’s help to see visions as windows of our future; of dreams that will pull us forward; with goals as the vehicle that can get us there. This year’s District Conference theme does just that. It invited the Spirit of God to: “Move In Our Midst.”

The Spirit is already moving, a new day is being born when:

- ◆ A congregation pauses to pray, to discern what God is up to in their congregation, then charts a course in following God into a new venture.
- ◆ Our District has two/three Commissions that use the gifts and interest of volunteers, developing community while engaging in meeting human need of our neighbors. (Climate and Racial Justice)
- ◆ A congregation has the courage to ask for help, or when we can get beyond our isolation of “singing solo” and build bridges that help us to “sing in harmony.”

Southern Ohio/Kentucky District has a chorus of sisters and brothers who are taking the lead to inform, resource and come along side those who are ready to address the “fetters that bind,” to lift the “weight of its wrong,” and with the Spirit of God to “love with heart, soul and mind” once again. **Dayton BDM Site** – Volunteers at the Dayton site are repairing a tornado damaged home on Greenbrook Drive in Trotwood. This home has seen major progress in the past month, after work was halted when the contractor disappeared. The family of six is so looking forward to being able to return home after two years of living apart. Through “The Tornado Survivors Pathways to Home Ownership Program”, two houses are being rebuilt. The first is on Marlin Avenue and the other on Natchez Avenue, both in Trotwood.

**Volunteer in Dayton** – Volunteers are needed at the Dayton BDM site for two days, Thursday and Friday, July 1-2. There are also openings throughout the summer when groups don't have a full crew. Volunteers of all skill levels are welcome! Leadership and tools will be provided. Lodging and meals are provided at the housing site on S. Smithville Road, Dayton.
