FLOOD UPDATE:

While in some ways it seems that the flood of 2021 is ancient history, in many ways the effects of it are still present daily. As the weather turns colder, that fact is making itself more vividly obvious. Many are still suffering, and so I believe an update is in order. Hopefully a reminder of what we have been able to do will rekindle your generous spirits, as we pray for and continue to serve those most directly harmed by the disaster.

1. Immediately after the flood, the church was able to provide food for victims and relief workers as well as hosting Baptist On Mission teams.

2. We are hosting the temporary police station, storing items from the Colonial Theater, and offering meeting space and other needs to the town when necessary.

3. We host blood drives that used to take place at the town hall. 4. Your generosity helped (and continues to help) flood victims as well as other community members with food and scarce resources which was helpful not only to those harmed by the flood, but also those affected by the ongoing supply chain shortage.

5. The "Keeping Haywood Warm" initiative started three years ago by Jean, and maintained by your wonderful volunteer efforts, has gone from a few big events to an ongoing ministry. As people have had needs (for instance, those who had to strip their houses of insulation to remediate mold, but have not yet been able to replace it) for warmth items, we have been able to meet their needs. 6. We have been able to provide firewood to those who heat their

houses with wood, but whose logs washed away in the flood. 7. We have funded individual projects, but also work with the Canton Missional Network's flood response team (of which I am a part) to contribute to the relief effort through funding and volunteerism. 8. In addition to individuals and families, we were able to assist several small businesses that asked for help in rebuilding.

The process of recovering from this event is a long one. I am thankful to serve a church that is connected to its community and committed to serve God by serving that community for the long haul. May you be blessed as you work to bless your neighbors.
