To Teach the Biblical Function of Men in a “Solidarity” relationship with Jesus Christ.

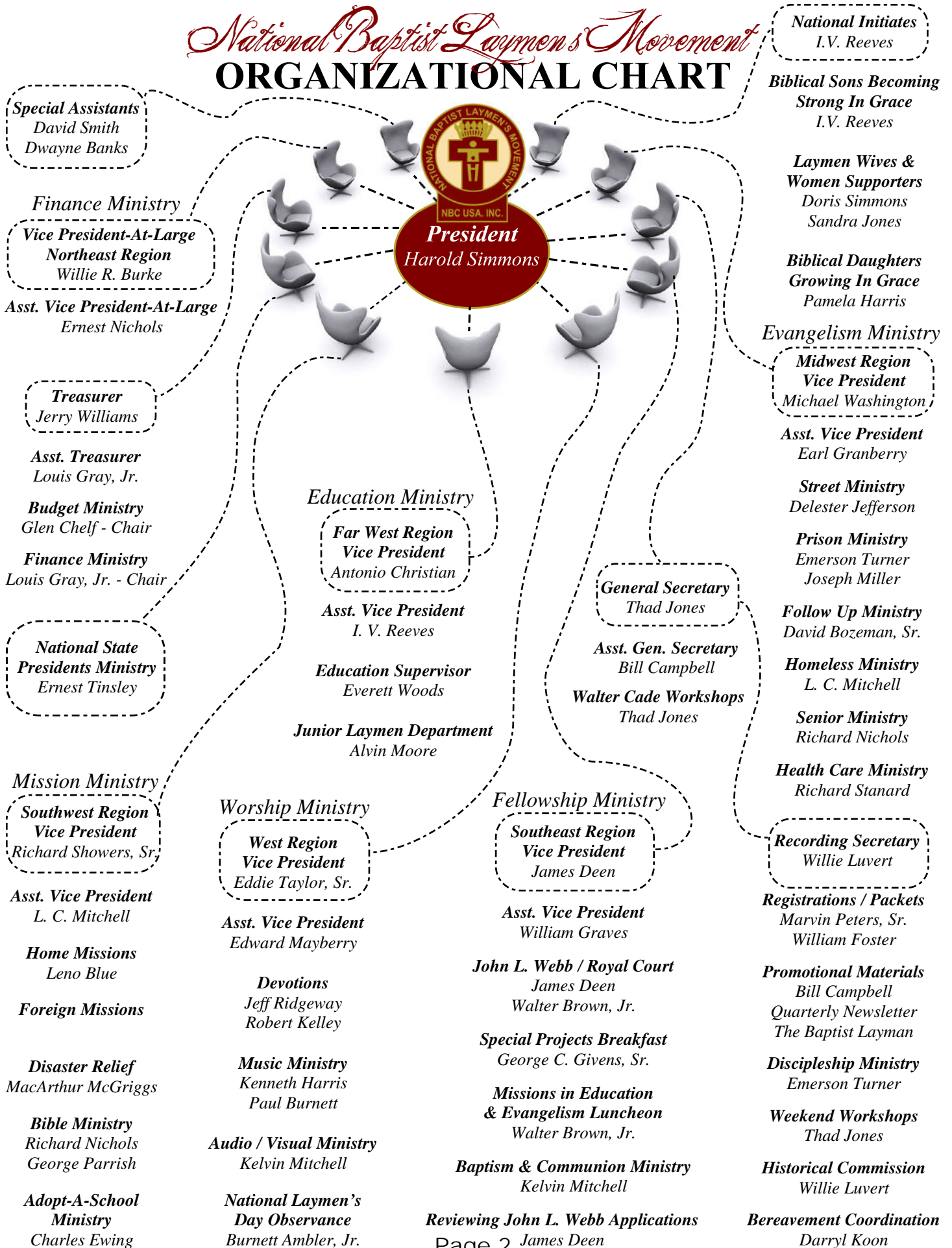

Annual Report

Purpose: To assist and support the Foreign Mission Board of the National Baptist Convention USA, Inc., in its efforts to provide for nine (9) mission stations and our brothers and sisters in Africa and South America.

Mission Statement: To fulfill the great commission of Jesus Christ as it is written in Matthew 28: 19-20, in Africa and South America.

Mission: To do God's will; Go ye therefore and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost; teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you; and lo I am with you always, even unto the end of the World." *Matthew 28:19-20*

This mission implies service in the name of Jesus Christ. The Laymen's Foreign Mission Ministry seeks to accomplish this mission by providing resources that will assist the Foreign Mission Board in providing:

- Resources for our ministers' to preach and teach the gospel of Jesus Christ.
- Educational materials and supplies for our schools and day care centers.
- Medical equipment, medicine and supplies for our clinics, hospitals and mobile clinics.
- Maintenance and repairs of our schools, day care centers and medical facilities on our mission stations.
- Baptist theological training for ministers.
- Food for the feeding ministries.
- The cost of shipping clothing, supplies, etc., to our mission stations.
- Occupational and educational training.
- Stipends for missionaries, teachers, medical personnel and other mission station staff.

Vision: To engage and involve Laymen in foreign mission and foreign mission activities in every state convention, district association and local churches within the National Baptist Convention USA, Inc.

Actions/Activities: Since being appointed to lead the Foreign Mission Ministry in April of this year, I've spent much time and effort in implementing a ministry structure that will allow the ministry to accomplish its mission, vision and goals in an organized and efficient manner. All of the Walter Cade, Jr. Workshop Coordinators have been contacted for their input as well as some State and District Laymen Presidents. My initial goal was to have a structure in place prior to this annual session. However, developing a solid structure from ground level is challenging and demanding. Therefore, the anticipated date for completion is November 2013. Please see the attached ministry structure.

Foreign Mission Ministry (cont'd)

This past June, I attended the Foreign Mission sessions in St. Louis, MO. I had an opportunity to meet with Rev. William B. Moore, Foreign Mission Board Chairman, Rev. Nicholas Richards, Executive Secretary for the Board, as well as some board members. I also had the pleasure of meeting Sister Delores Collins, Foreign Mission Office Manager in Philadelphia, PA. As a result, I received a wealth of information about the Foreign Mission Board and its works in Africa and South America. During our meeting, I was astounded by the projected budget of the Foreign Mission Board to accomplish its works in nine mission stations in Africa and South America. There is a great need for additional funding and resources. The 2013 budget, consisting of domestic and international expenses, is only \$1,193,343. There is no doubt in my mind that with the help of God and the cooperation of our laymen and laymen supporters across this country, we can have a significant impact on the foreign mission budget and the work being done by the National Baptist Foreign Mission Board to help our brothers and sisters across the waters to experience the power of God.

Goal: It is my goal as chairman of the ministry, to contribute, with the help of every man that makes up this National Baptist Laymen's Movement, at least \$200,000 by the 2014 Annual Session. This may appear to be an aggressive goal, but with the assistance and commitment of dedicated leaders and workers, including local churches, we can reach this goal and more.

Recommendations:

- To have a Region Laymen Foreign Mission Coordinator for each region within our convention.
- To have a State Laymen Foreign Mission Coordinator for each state convention laymen movement.
- To have a District Laymen Foreign Mission Coordinator for each District Association.
- To have a Laymen Foreign Mission Representative in each local church.

All of the aforementioned coordinators will have a position description outlining the characteristics of the person suited for these positions as well as their duties and responsibilities.

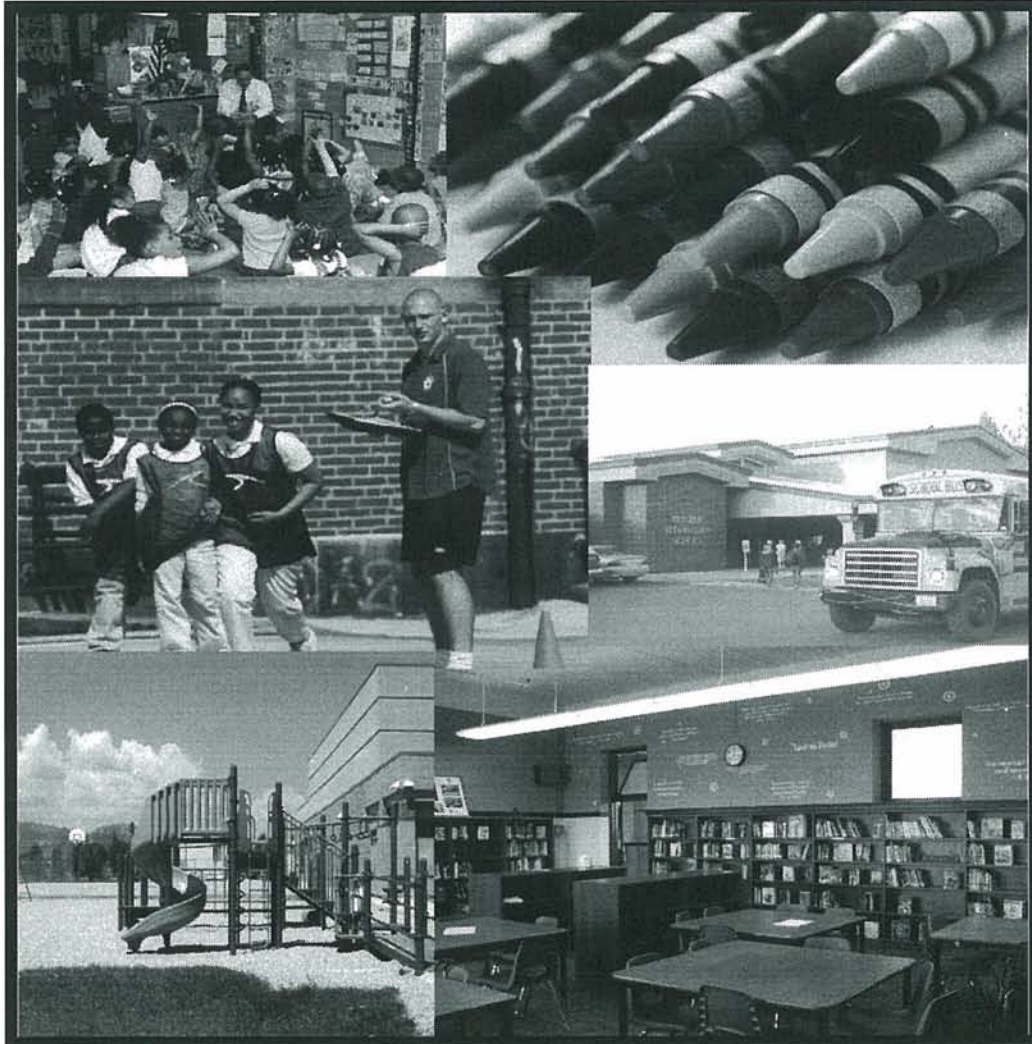

2013 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Completed development of the Training Handbook, Power Point presentations and other items to support delivering the Workshop during the Annual Session.
- During the 2012 Annual Session in Atlanta, GA presented the first Adopt-A-School Workshop.
 - Twenty two (22) Convention attendees participated in the Workshop and received materials that will assist with the implementation of the Adopt-A-School ministry when they return home.
 - Adopt-A-School materials were also distributed to Laymen and Supporters that could not attend the Workshop during the Annual Session.

- Director Charles Ewing briefed the Laymen Movement during a General Session.
- Brother Charlie Richmond of Tyler, TX has joined the Adopt-A-School Team.
- The Team continues to meet regularly via teleconference to discuss progress and next steps.
- The Team members and their church have successfully adopted a school in their area or are in the process of implementing the ministry.
- Brother Tinsley as Director of the State Presidents Advisory Council has asked each State President to commit to getting a school adopted. The State Presidents have accept this challenge.
- Brother Kendrick has begun to develop a web page for the Adopt-A-School Ministry on the National Baptist Laymen web site.
- Brother Pope delivered a Ministry update during the 2013 Mid-Winter Board Meeting in January 2013 and at the Southwest Laymen Workshop held in Jackson MS in July 2013.
- The Team continues to responds to requests for materials from Laymen and Supporters throughout the National Baptist Laymen Movement.
- Began work to develop a companion document for the Survey form to collect activities and events used by churches when a school has been adopted.

FUTURE PLANS

- Develop a support system for local churches, Districts, and State Conventions to use as they implement Adopt-A-School.
- Develop measuring tools to assist local churches determine guidance for moving to the next level of the ministry
- Develop measurement tools for the Ministry to track implementation progress and processes.
- Complete development of the web page on the National Laymen's website and develop other marketing methods.

The National Baptist Junior Laymen Basketball Tournament opened at 10:00 a.m. at Demetrious Johnson Charitable Foundation, 724 Union Street, St. Louis, Missouri.

Five states participated in the tournament: Alabama, Kansas, Illinois, Missouri, and Oklahoma. Scores from the semi-final games were:

- Alabama 56 vs. Oklahoma 38 (Alabama was led by Justin Coleman with 21 points and Oklahoma by Sanders with 20 points)
- Kansas 47 vs. Missouri 21
- Missouri 42 vs. Illinois 16

The championship game was held Tuesday.

Tuesday, June 18, 2013

The National Baptist Junior Laymen Basketball Tournament opened at 4:00 p.m. at Demetrious Johnson Charitable Foundation, 724 Union Street, St. Louis, Missouri.

The third place winner was Oklahoma with 36 points vs. Missouri with 30 points. Oklahoma was led by Sanders, with 18 points.

The championship game was an exciting game with Alabama emerging, again this year, as the 2013 champions. The game scores were; Alabama with 60 points and Kansas with 33 points. Justin Coleman, an Alabama native, scored the most points in the tournament with 46 points against Oklahoma 21 and 25 points against Kansas in the championship game.

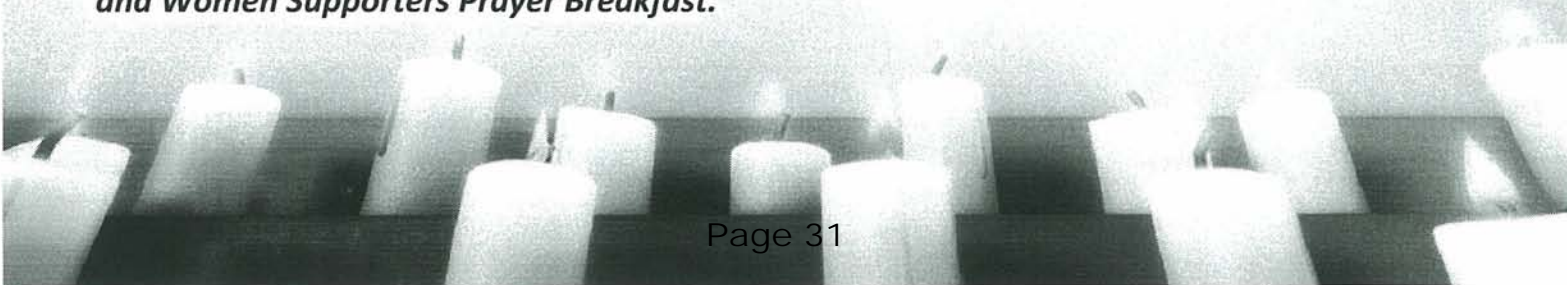

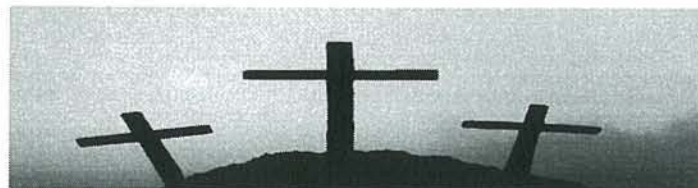

PRISON MINISTRY

Annual Report

On June 19th, Bro. Jeff Ridgeway and myself visited the St Louis Justice Center (County Jail Annex) and conducted religious service. We were met by Chaplain (Rev.) Ralph Neal and two of his support staff, Ministers Davis and Young. The facility houses approximately 1,300 inmates.

We were able to minister to 22 young men across the A, B, C & D Pods from the central theme *"Dead End or New Start"* based on the Luke 15:11-24 text.

Of the 22 men present, approximately 18 rededicated their lives to Christ and responded to the call to *"Come to their senses and Go Back Home"*

On Thursday night, June 20th, 13 volunteers visited the Minimum Security Institute (St Louis) and ministered to some 42 inmates. We dealt with the same subject matter as the previous night, *"Dead End or New Start"*, from Luke 15:11-24. Of the 42 or so in attendance, some 37 rededicated their lives. While there were no new converts in either of our settings, it is good to know that some of those who are behind the walls are merely those who have fallen and our message to them is simply get back up.

In summary:

- We made 64 contacts
- We witnessed some 55 rededications
- We provided some 15 volunteers opportunities
- We trained and provided training for some 10 -11 students

We solicit your prayers for this ministry that we continue to make a difference in the lives of those who are left behind and disenfranchised.

We now turn our attention to Charlotte, NC for our September session. Bro. Richmond Turner and I have already had preliminary conversation.

DISCIPLESHIP MINISTRY COMMITTEE

Annual Report

MISSION STATEMENT

To process and record all information of men and other supporters who have become members of the National Baptist Laymen's Movement via registering in the Discipleship Ministry.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this ministry is to harness the manpower of the laymen and to clearly identify those that love the Lord and those who desire to be identified with an organization on the move. This ministry provides opportunities to build relationships, as well as provides the movement financial assistance in its operational processes.

MISSION

The discipleship ministry is designed to identify all the men and supporters of the National Baptist Laymen. It is an annual program that asks for \$40.00 once a year for seniors and \$25.00 for juniors. The month of January is Discipleship Drive Month. Laymen are asked to sign up all the men of their local congregations, district associations and state conventions. Discipleship sign-ups should be reported during the convention's Mid-Winter board meeting held in January. Discipleship fees are welcomed throughout the year from persons who are not able to bring or send them in January.

ACTIONS/ ACTIVITIES

Our goal was to have a database that truly reflects the status of our discipleships in accordance with our mission statement. We are happy to report, that exclusive of standard errors created by the movement of disciples and other challenging logistics, we have completed those actions.

From the database we are able to print address labels monthly for the "birthday card ministry" as well as for periodic mailings. These tasks can now be performed in minutes. Additionally, we can provide mailing labels specifically targeting state presidents as well as district presidents. Going forward, and as the need arises, this should be a tremendous enhancement as it relates to our ability to target communications.

Our goal has been to turn around discipleship cards within 2 business days after receipt of notification. While we don't keep an actual statistic, we are comfortable that that goal is being met well over 99% of the time. Today, we rarely hear of a complaint relative to someone not receiving their discipleship card.

DISCIPLESHIP MINISTRY COMMITTEE (cont'd)

Annual Report

The printing of discipleship cards continues to be available at the national meetings. Disciples should be able to take their cards home with them after registration.

ON-SITE CARD PRINTING

Over the past years, it is apparent that sufficient discipline has developed where the overwhelming majority of discipleship cards are printed in January. From the recent June session, not a single card was printed. As such, we will no longer provide the facility to print cards on-site at the congress and convention. There are costs associated with the shipping of the equipment without any benefit to the movement.

AMENITIES

All participants in this ministry will receive:

- A Discipleship Card
- Placed on the laymen's mailing list
- Receives the laymen's Quarterly Newsletter
- Receives a Birthday card on their birthday
- Receives three major mail-outs and/or emails a year. Housing forms included.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Continue to improve the legibility of the media from which we garner discipleship information; including completeness of forms, with correct addresses, church homes, state and district officers, etc. This will allow us to use the database to target disciples by state president, local districts and the like.
- We are also looking into ways to assist the Laymen registration process to allow direct entry by the registration team, thus eliminating the duplication of effort.
- Investigate the use of bar codes for ease of updating and garnering information.

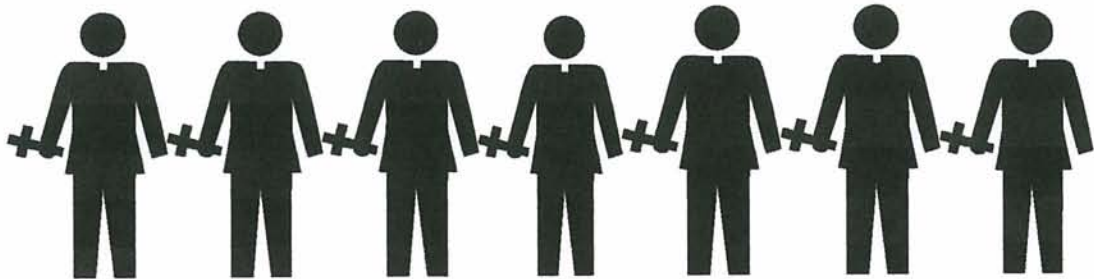

STATE PRESIDENTS' ADVISORY COUNCIL

ANNUAL REPORT

The purpose of the State Presidents' Advisory Council is to provide a forum for state presidents to:

- (1) Develop methods by which the National Baptist Laymen's Movement (NBLM) can assist state presidents (How can the NBLM help state presidents?);
- (2) Develop suggestions to enhance the ministry of the NBLM (How can state presidents help the NBLM?);
- (3) Share best practices (How can state presidents help each other?).

In September, 2012 at the Annual Session in Atlanta we conducted a class in which we discussed methods of enhancing the effectiveness of the work of state presidents. Twenty-eight state presidents were in attendance.

In January, 2013 on the weekend before the Board Meeting we gathered in Nashville for our annual meeting. At that time we introduced the Council's newly appointed Leadership Team, consisting of Bros. Jimmie Maxwell, L. C. Mitchell, I.V. Reeves, Marvin Walker, Sam Moore, William A Graves, Jr., Ernest Nichols, and Edward Mayberry. Each of these brothers is responsible for working with an assigned group of state presidents. In addition, Bro. Robert Pope serves as the Administrator of the team, and has been an invaluable addition.

The rest of the Annual Meeting was devoted to exercises and training. The presidents participated in developing a list of 23 leadership traits in a session entitled "What Do Leaders Do?" They were also presented with a workshop entitled "10 Steps to being a Successful State President."

Finally, the presidents agreed to take on two challenges for 2013. First, after hearing a presentation on the Adopt-A-School Ministry, each state president agreed to initiate programs in his convention in a number equal to the number of districts in his convention. For instance, if a state convention has six districts, that state president is committed to adopting six schools this year.

Second, upon the recommendation of Bro. Ernest Nichols, the state presidents agreed to support the financial goals of the National Baptist Laymen's Movement. Each president committed to register himself, his wife (if married), his church, and his state convention at the June and September sessions of the National Movement. In addition, the state presidents agree to take out a discipleship at the January Session for himself, his wife, and his pastor, and to register his church and convention at this session. At the Annual Session in Charlotte each state president will be requested to give a report on his progress on these two commitments.

State President's Council (cont'd)

During the course of the year the Leadership team has met twice via conference call, and all of the state presidents were called together for a conference call. Participation on these calls has been encouraging, and we anticipate increased participation as more state presidents see the value of participating in this effort.
