**WITH ALL YOUR HEART, SOUL, MIND AND STRENGTH**

When someone asked Jesus which was the greatest commandment, he did not quote one of the well-known Ten Commandments. He quoted the Shema. The Shema is a declaration of the Hebrew Faith that is repeated daily. It is recorded in Deuteronomy 6:4,5.

***“Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God is one.” [Or, “The Lord is our God, the Lord alone”] “Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength.”***

The heart, for the Hebrew people, has to do with the whole person. It is not just that part of us that expresses an emotional attachment to something, but it has to do with every part of a person’s being: their spirit, their soul [which is the seat of the mind, will and emotions], and strength, which has to do with the physical expression of that in which we believe.

Therefore, to love the Lord with all our heart is to love him with every part of our being, including the way in which we live out that love in how we think, in what we say and in what we do.

Jesus quickly ties the declaration of Love for God with love for each other: ***“And the second is like it, ‘You will love your neighbor as yourself.’*** Love of God and love of people are tied together. In another place in Scripture we are told, ***For anyone does not love his brother, whom he has seen, cannot love God, who he has not seen.*** [I John 4:20]

Love does not happen in a vacuum. It must have an object. You don’t just go out, stand on your front porch and love. Love is directed to some thing or some one.

God is love and God’s love must have an object. The object of God’s love is people. You and I are the objects of God’s love. God and other people are the objects of our love, imitating the nature of God.

Love involves commitment. God’s love for us compels him to be committed to our welfare and our love for God compels us to be committed to thinking, saying and doing those things that reflect our love response to him.

I want to suggest that there are levels of commit-

ment in our love for God and for others. These levels are perfectly outlined in the vision that God gave Ezekiel of the River of Life running from the Temple into the Dead Sea, bringing life wherever it flowed. [47:1-9]

The angel led Ezekiel one quarter mile out into the River and he was ankle deep. It is possible to have an ankle deep commitment to God. Though it may look good, it is shallow. We are still in control of our lives. It is a level at which we are “in” one day and “out” the next. We try to live by faith and sight at the same time. We try to walk in the Spirit and in the flesh at the same time. There is little or no commitment.

The angel led Ezekiel another quarter mile and he is in the River up to his knees. The pull is stronger toward the middle than to the shore. I suggest this is the level of commitment at which we begin to pray and learn how to communicate with the One who teaches us how to love. It cannot be ankle deep prayer, but a depth of prayer that moves us to call on God in every aspect of our lives. We move from “now I lay me down to sleep,” prayers to, “O God, grant me wisdom for this hour,” prayers.

The angel led Ezekiel another quarter mile into the River and now he is waist deep. The water covers his digestive system and reproductive organs. At this level of commitment we begin to digest the things of the Kingdom of God and our spirits are nurtured by the truth of God’s Word. We commit ourselves to live according to the ways of God’s Kingdom rather than the ways of the world. This level of commitment brings us to share the love of God with others and help them to come into a living and vital relationship with Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit reproduces heirs of the Kingdom as he works in and through us and our commitment to be about his work.

The angel led Ezekiel another quarter mile into the River. He is now in over his head. Here he must sink or swim. There is a level of commitment to God where we are in over our heads. This is the level of commitment at which we are carried along by the

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Person and Work of the Holy Spirit. It is the place at which our passion and our desire is to be and do that which blesses people around us but, even more than that, bring Joy to the heart of God our Father. It is at this level of commitment that we are truly able to *“Love the Lord our God with all our heart, with all our soul and with all our strength. And, we are also able to love our neighbors as ourselves.”*

In the month of February there is an emphasis on love, or, what we call, “Valentine’s Day.” It is a time when we take opportunity, through cards letters and other expressions, to verbalize our love for people around us.

For followers of Jesus Christ, it is a 24/7, day in and day out way of living out our love for our Lord God. We love—and we are able to love, because he first loved us, the objects of his love.

I encourage each and all of us to so commit our lives to Jesus Christ that we find that we are continually “in over our heads” relying totally upon the Holy Spirit to show us how to demonstrate our love for God in every part of our being.
