

On the actual birthday of George Washington, the founder of our country, I went to see the new movie about the founder of our faith, Jesus Christ. The movie is "Risen." It is another film by Affirmed Films, a group that has produced over 30 films designed to offer compelling entertainment and to point people toward God. This is their biggest budget project so far and I think their best. It opened last weekend with the second biggest box office of the week. I would encourage you to see it. It is appropriate for children 8 and older.

The film focuses on the leader of the Roman Centurions (played by Joseph Fiennes) who is charged with keeping the peace in Jerusalem. The centurion is ambitious and brutally efficient in putting down the numerous violent revolts by the zealous Jewish factions. Killing is part of his job. During the volatile Passover celebration, Jesus becomes just one of the victims of Pontius Pilate's squashing of political and religious dissent in the city. Due to Jesus' popularity, he is deemed a threat and one of many who are crucified. Immediately following his crucifixion, Pilate and the Sanhedrin hear troubling rumors that Jesus' rabid followers would take his body and claim he was resurrected. In spite of the familiar efforts to keep the dead Jesus in the tomb, his body disappears. The Centurion is tasked with finding out "what happened to the Nazarene?" This becomes his journey to faith.

This is the first account of Jesus' life that focuses on what happens after the crucifixion. The story takes us out of Jerusalem and back to Galilee where Jesus appears to the disciples and then leaves them there after he ascends. The film ends with the disciples getting ready to answer the great commission.

The movie is inspiring. It is designed for non-believers who are not familiar with the story. It dispenses with theological jargon and downplays the miraculous. It is far better than last year's television series on the Old Testament. The violence of the crucifixion is kept to a minimum while still being true to the story.

The movie asks some timely questions about the purpose of life. We are given a viewpoint on Jesus from two individuals (the Centurion and Pontius Pilate) who view Jesus as another tiresome nuisance in their jobs. Peter and the other disciples are presented in a fresh and I think appropriate way. They really don't know for sure what will happen next. They just have learned to trust Jesus.

I think it is well worth seeing and discussing. I am planning to attend the showing on Sunday, March 6th at Regal Cinema Bowie at 1:40PM. I missed the first 20 minutes of the film when I went the first time! This gives you time to go home after the "Pasta Palooza" luncheon. You are free to join me or see it at some other time. An Adult Education seminar on Sunday March 13th at 9:30AM will discuss the movie and its message.

Also, if you want to grow in your faith and develop some meaningful Christ-centered friendships, I strongly encourage you to join the new evening Bible study group, "Straight from the Source." The study group will meet at the church on the 1st, 3rd, and 5th Monday nights starting at 7:00PM. Justin is a very skilled and experienced Bible study leader. He has led youth, college students, and adults in similar classes for many years. You don't need a strong knowledge of the Bible to fit in the group. Before you know it you will discover that the Bible does indeed speak to your life and experiences. Make the decision to connect with others and with the source of our faith.

Visiting the Public Hospital in Guatemala

Today, we experienced heartbreak and another reality of how life is for the poor in Guatemala. This was our first visit to the public hospital in Xela where we live. We received a call from Carmelina that her husband Pedro was in the hospital. They are dear sweet Maya Quiche souls. Sandi met them both in 2001 when she did a workshop on domestic violence. Pedro was the only male attending and has continued to be supportive of Carmelina and the rights of women.

We offered to visit on Sunday because from 1:00 to 2:30 PM was the time and day they could receive more than one visitor at a time. As we walked in, it was hard to believe the number of people, waiting and milling around outside. Carmelina came down five flights of stairs to meet us in the lobby. The elevator didn't work, so we began the hike up the dark stairway through crowds of people. The hallways and lobbies were jammed with people, mostly indigenous. As we waded through, we finally arrived in Pedro's room. The smells were pungent and the level of cleanliness was concerning. Doctors or nurses were not visible. There were eight beds in each room, four on each wall with a crowded walkway between them. Pedro was sitting up in a chair on the window wall visiting with his daughters and grandson.

If you want food, have your family bring it. If you need a bandage, you need to buy your own. If you need medicine, same story — go out and buy it. The medicine he needs is too expensive for the family. Because they can't afford the medication to improve his condition, he will not be able to have the operation he came for. After eight days in the hospital and no improvement, he will go home.

Between corruption and resources not getting through the bureaucracy, and a tax system that only favors the rich, once again, the poor suffer. Why Lord? The light of the Holy Spirit was shining brightly amongst us; they were asking for prayer. As I led, everyone joined in, and the crescendo of pleas, begging, helplessness, fear, tears, and being together merged into something wonderful, in a place that is anything but wonderful.


