

The gospels are sometimes referred to as "Holy Week with a long introduction and a brief conclusion." If that is the case, we appropriately poured a lot into Holy Week at CCPC. We had a great single service of worship on Palm Sunday. Our trumpeters Sarah Huey and Matt Novak led a rousing "Ride On, Ride On in Majesty!" to open the service. Sam Guillermo led the children in singing "Your Love Awakens Me" to close the service. The Pasta Palooza luncheon was wonderful. Special thanks to Chef Kevin Smith. We had good attendance for Maundy Thursday and our best ever attendance for Good Friday. Chuck Tanner took the 11 faithful souls who read the daily Lenten readings at 7:15AM each morning out to breakfast on Maundy Thursday. Three Easter services: Sunrise in the Garden at 7AM, Contemporary at 9AM, and the Traditional service at 11AM, concluded the week. The Session members prepared the Easter breakfast. Many volunteers worked long and hard to tell this timeless story. Thank you!

I wanted to thank Interim Music Director Jon Youngdahl, accompanist's Nolan King and Janyce Watt, for leading us in this interim period. Trudy Neff directed the Bell Choir on Easter Sunday as they played two pieces and led congregational singing of "O for a Thousand Tongues." Thank you Trudy!

I went home after the final service and had lunch with my son and his wife. When they left to go back to New Jersey, I took a long nap. At 8PM, I watched the NBC program "Jesus Christ Superstar Live in Concert." This Broadway Musical from 1970 featured the music of Andrew Lloyd Webber and Tim Rice. As a teen I listened to the two album set constantly. I know the songs by heart. Although controversial at the time, the show was a hit with believers and non-believers alike. This was during the Christian revival among young people known as "The Jesus Movement." Told principally from the point of view of Judas, "Superstar" interpreted the events of the trial and crucifixion by giving special attention to the social and political milieu of first century Jerusalem. The rock music tapped into the civil unrest in America caused by the Vietnam War and the assassinations of Robert and John Kennedy, Malcom X and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. The show depicted King Herod, Pontius Pilate, and the Jewish authorities as not unlike the corrupt, cynical and manipulative political powers in the early 1970's. The show tapped into the spirit of the age.

The New York Times reporter Michael Paulson interviewed the lead performers in this live show. Singer John Legend (playing Jesus) had not done musical theatre since High School. Raised in a family of church musicians in a Pentecostal Church, Legend said, "I had a hard time turning down the role of Jesus." He prepared for his role by thinking about love and what that means when it comes to the sacrifice that Jesus was willing to make.

Victor Dixon (Judas) was raised in an Episcopal Church and School. He loved the role because it connected with the deep human emotions that have always been central to his faith. Judas, says Dixon, feels his actions are right, because he wants to preserve Jesus message against the authorities who fear that his message of hope and change are spinning out of control.

Both Legend and Dixon admitted to no longer being active churchgoers. They both claim to be "spiritual but not religious." Both performers said the underlying thing about the shows appeal is that everyone still wants to know about Jesus. The show does not have a resurrection scene. After watching the $2\frac{1}{2}$ -hour show (too many commercials!) I felt like my exhausted spirit was risen.

Worship Notes

April 8: In Paul's letters to the Church in Corinth we find the first written testimonies of the resurrection found in the New Testament. Paul says nothing of the women discovering the empty tomb, but he does pass on the core convictions about the meaning of the resurrection to the Christian faith. *I Corinthians* 15:1-20, will serve as the text for the three-week series on the meaning of the Resurrection. Sermon title is "Of First Importance." Communion will be celebrated at both services.

April 15: In *Acts 5:27-32*, we find the disciples being arrested for teaching others about Jesus and the resurrection. The authorities, hoping to keep public order, threaten to jail Peter and the other Apostles if they did not keep silent. They spoke out anyway. The sermon: "Easter Continued."

April 22: Although the resurrection from the dead was a central testimony of the early church, believers had questions about what happened to them when they died. The Apostles Creed states, "I believe in the resurrection of the body and the life everlasting." Texts are I Corinthians 15:35-44 and Revelation 21. Sermon is titled: "Good Heavens"
